"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without Him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in Him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of a Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

John 1:1-5, 14 NRSV

This passage of scripture is one of my favorites to read during Advent. It is perfect to read at the beginning because it reminds me of what Advent and Christmas are all about. Jesus, the Word, has always been. He is one with the Father and the Spirit. He was active at the creation of the world and throughout the days of the Old Testament. And when the appointed time finally came, He entered the world as a human baby. "And the Word became flesh and lived among us"

What does it mean that the Son of God entered into the world and dwelt among us? During Advent we reflect on how He was the fulfillment of prophecy and the object of the waiting Jewish nation. We talk about the example He was of perfect love and truth. We also talk about how He would grow up to live out being "Messiah" differently than expected. It was a different fulfillment but brought a much bigger outcome. The Father's plan for a Messiah would end in resurrection from the grave, bringing about victory over death. We celebrate Advent as God breaking through to bring about the solution of the human condition. This Word that became flesh and lived among us would make it possible for all humanity to be connected to God, be free from sin and live forever.

Those are the big themes of Advent. But what I want to encourage you to do is answer the question above personally. What does it mean that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us? How does this truth bring hope to your life?

For me, Advent is the story of God encountering the world. We see in the stories leading up to Christmas, God encountering people to bring about His purpose and plan. God did it then and God does it now. Advent encourages me to recall the ways that God has encountered me and gives me hope of more that God wants to do. So I enter the season of Advent with anticipation for how God wants to move in my life.

God wants to encounter you as well. So, think through the questions above. Let your answers lead you in prayer about the season of Advent. I pray that God will encounter all of our lives in a fresh renewing way, so that we will walk into 2025 with the bar raised in our lives in the areas of Hope, Peace, Love and Joy. Those are the beautiful benefits of a relationship with Christ. And I believe God wants to encounter us every day to develop those blessings in our lives. That is the beautiful thing about Advent, it is the season of wonder, reflection and anticipation of what God can do.

I look forward to journey with you this Advent season. I am praying for you and the entire church to be renewed and invigorated as you prepare your hearts for Christmas!
