What do you love about church? What do you love about Central Rogers United Methodist Church? This is the time of year to take a moment and ask those types of questions because we are heading into our Commitment Sunday. This year we are calling this day Consecration Sunday. This is the day we lay down our commitments for the next year of how we will support the church through our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Do those words sound familiar? That is because those are the actions we ask all members to commit to as members of Central Rogers church community.

Each of those actions do two important things. One is that by doing each we grow in our relationship with God. The second is that through each, we support the work of the church in community, nation and world. During the weeks leading up to the big day, we have been talking about the vision and mission of the church. Even though the denomination has gone through challenging times, God has continued to be with us and make clear ways for us to continue to live out our mission to connect people to Jesus Christ and help them grow to maturity in their relationship with Christ. Seeing God transform lives, situations, families, neighborhoods and relationships is a beautiful thing I get to witness consistently here at Central Rogers. This is why I take every chance I get to brag on this church and express how blessed I am to be the Sr. Pastor.

I want to highlight each of those five ways we promise to serve God and the church. But first I have to tell you about my grandson, Sutton. Have I told you I have a grandson? Well, his vocabulary and ability to talk is getting better each time I see him. I was able to go see him in September for his 2nd birthday and was able to spend a lot of quality time with him. One of the things he is doing these days is using the word "big" to describe doing something in a significant intentional way. For example, he wanted me to swing him. After I put him in the swing he started saying, big high Pappy - big high. I thought he wanted me to swing him harder. But I learned through trial and error he just wanted a good long intentional swing. He might say, "big drink Pappy" meaning he wanted a good significant thirst quenching drink. Do you get what Sutton is talking about? It took me a little bit, but then I figured it out.

Well, here is the thing about leaning into all five of the ways to commit to the church. You will "big" experience God. Meaning, it won't just be a group of numerous experiences but God will show up in your life in a significant, intentional, and life changing way. And the church will be "big" supported to make a difference in the community around us.

So, throughout this Stewardship season you have been challenged to commit in a different way each week. On the first two Sundays of October you will have a time to prayerfully consider how God is calling you to serve and support Central Rogers. I ask you to support the church in all five ways, big. I encourage you to support our church through your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness in intentional, meaningful, significant ways. And here is the thing. You will see God do amazing things through your commitment in the life of the church, others, and in your own life. That is how I learned long ago how God works. Our God is Big. He cares big, He moves big, and God loves Big.

## LAITY SUNDAY OCTOBER 6, 2024

"Whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant." Mark 10:43

Laity Sunday celebrates the ministry of all Christians as they love God and neighbor. On Laity Sunday, we continue to lift up the vocation of all to follow the way of Jesus and lead others to him.

In the Fall of 1762 John Wesley wrote a short letter to a layperson and dear friend, Dorothy Furly. She had questions about something perplexing to both laity and clergy alike in the early Methodist

movement: "Christian perfection" (aka sanctification or scriptural holiness). Was this some kind of rarefied state of flawless fidelity only attainable at death? Wesley's response was simple: "I want you to be all love. This is the perfection I believe and teach." All love means "love all until all love God." And all means all. Laity Sunday helps us remember that our purpose is a call to be love—with and for the world God so loves. And Wesley believed we could be all love in this life. On Laity Sunday we remember and celebrate the mission behind the 24/7 efforts of the "all-called": "Beyond the diverse forms of ministry is this ultimate concern: that all persons will be brought into a saving relationship with God through Jesus Christ and be renewed after the image of their creator (Colossians 3:10)." —2016 Book of Discipline, ¶ 128, The Ministry of the Community

## Congregational Care: The Ministry of the Towel

I love to mountain bike. Here's a question that came up the other day while some friends and I were biking, "Would Jesus have been a mountain biker?" Or, "would Jesus have learned to knit?" or, "would Jesus have taken a Pack A Shoe Box to send to a needy child?". I don't know about Jesus riding a mountain bike, but I can imagine him coming along with a group of bikers to hang out with them to have a deep discussion about life, faith, or any number of spiritual topics we read about him discussing in the gospels. Oh, and the cool thing about Jesus hanging with a group of mountain bikers is if one of us takes a serious crash, which I have, he could just heal that person to get up and keep on riding!

Would Jesus have learned to knit or sew? The reason I ask that question is because every week a group of ladies gather here at the church to knit and sew blankets, hats, and scarves to give to people in need. So, my wondering about Jesus' knitting or sewing, is I could see Jesus hanging out with these wonderful ladies each week discussing the great issues of life. And is the routine each week, I cover the many prayer requests I have been given for the ladies to pray over and add to the list any requests they may know about. Jesus, I believe would love to hang out with these wonderful, faithful ladies to hear their concerns and experience their zeal for servant ministry.

Now for the last question: Would Jesus have packed a shoe box for a needy child? I would love to see what many of you think about this question. I don't know if he would or not. He might send his disciples into town to get some things to put in the box. Maybe he might even send his disciples down to the river to catch a fish that has many toys in its mouth to fill the shoe box.

My point with all these stories, is all of them represent an aspect of The Ministry of the Towel. When Jesus girded himself with a towel and began to wash the disciples' feet, he demonstrated the idea that ministry is servanthood. And, whether we are mountain biking, sewing, or filling a shoe box for a needy child, when we are doing it as a ministry, we are in fact demonstrating the ministry of the towel. Ministry doesn't have to be done in the confines of the church. In fact, most of the time it is done in the many activities of life. Never underestimate the ministry of the towel and know that it comes in many forms. That is the reason all of us can participate in the ministry of the towel utilizing our gifts and passions for the advancement of the kingdom of God. God has called each of us to wrap the servant towel around our waist and wash the feet of those in need.

## Men's Fellowship Breakfast Saturday, October 12, 7:00a - Atrium



Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.
