Happy fall Central church family! At the time of your reading this article I am sure it doesn't feel like fall. Plus we are not really there until the 22nd. But September is when we start heading into my favorite time of the year. I love the fall leaves, the World Series, and football. But as a runner I love the weather. Nothing better than a late afternoon run in the fall.

September marks something significant for us as well. On September 29th we will officially end the Old Testament reading section of the Bible Recap reading plan. Since January 1st we have been traveling through the Old Testament. It has been a journey, hasn't it? I have loved talking with you all about the high and low points of the Old Testament.

So, no matter how you have engaged (either reading it daily, listening to the podcast or listening to the sermons only in this reading plan, what has stood out to you about the Old Testament? One thing for me is that there are some other hard to read books other than Leviticus. That is the book we always joke ends our Bible reading journey because it's so hard to get through. But if you can get past it there are some other hurdles, aren't there? For me the prophets are tough. I am writing this in August and I have been going through Isaiah, Jeremiah, Joel, and Ezekiel. There are some hard sections to understand and to read in those books.

But I have also remembered that there are other really good books other than Genesis and Joshua. I think Daniel is one of my favorites. The stories in Daniel of his faith to choose to obey God when it could mean certain death really push me. Just think, he chose to obey God after being taken into slavery. Because Daniel and his friends trusted God with all their hearts, they saw God move in powerful and dramatic ways. That has been a lesson throughout the Old Testament for me, God wants us to put God first and trust Him. And normally it doesn't look like it's going to work but then God shows up.

We see this over and over in stories of the kings. We learn from kings like David, Hezekiah, and Josiah that if you choose to love God, with all your heart, you develop a faith that makes the way for significant results. I say "makes the way" because faith is like a road for God to move on to bring His will, truth and blessings. It is that deep faith of putting God first that brings those kinds of results. I have loved the historical books of the Old Testament (1st and 2nd Kings, 1st and 2nd Chronicles) for a long time. But reading them chronologically has brought new insights for me.

I could go on and on about my experience with the Old Testament this year. How about you? I would love to hear how God has spoken to you through the Old Testament as we come to its conclusion. If you have something you would like to share please email or text me.

It has been quite the journey and the beginning of the New Testament is going to be awesome. If you have dropped out or never started reading with us I want to invite you to start reading the New Testament with us on September 29th. God is speaking to so many people daily through this reading program. If you would like information on how to get started in September there is information on the Bible Recap section of our website or reach out to a pastor or staff person. We would love to help you get started.

I am praying for you as you conclude the Old Testament and begin the New Testament. I pray God gives you insight and understanding to grow deeper in your faith. Pray for me as well. It's still a challenge to preach on the reading but it is an exciting challenge where I have gotten to see God do great things!


