Nehemiah Chapter 5: Greed verses Generosity

Nehemiah 5 shifts the spotlight from external threats to internal injustice. The rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls is endangered—not by enemies outside, but by exploitation within. The chapter reveals Nehemiah's heart for justice, his courage to confront sin, and his example of sacrificial leadership.

ermon Notes

1. The Cry of the Hurting (vv. 1-5)

Families are starving, mortgaging fields, and selling children into slavery to pay the interest being charged by others. The greed comes from fellow Jews—those with wealth and power.

Reflection: Are there "walls" we're building while ignoring the suffering within our own community? What cries might we be missing?

2. Nehemiah's Righteous Anger (vv. 6-11)

Nehemiah listens, reflects, and rebukes the nobles and officials. He calls for restitution—returning fields, vineyards, homes, and canceling debts.

Reflection: Godly anger is not impulsive—it's purposeful. How can we channel righteous indignation into healing action?

3. A Community Response (vv. 12-13)

The people agree to Nehemiah's call. They say "Amen" and praise the Lord—justice becomes worship.

Reflection: When justice is restored, praise erupts. What hurts, once addressed, could lead to deeper unity and worship in our church?

4. Leadership by Example (vv. 14-19)

Nehemiah refuses the governor's allowance.

He feeds others from his own table—choosing sacrificial generosity over self-indulging privilege.

Reflection: True leadership costs something. What privileges might we lay down to serve others more fully?

Application Questions

How does the greed of the nobles in Nehemiah chapter 5 contrast with the generosity of Nehemiah?

What are some ways KBC has benefitted from the generosity of others? How could this impact be multiplied if everyone gave sacrificially?

Sacrificial generosity is the means through which God provides for the ministries of KBC. In what three ways do our members actively demonstrate their generosity and support for the work God is doing among us?
