Nehemiah Chapter 6

Read Nehemiah 6:1-19

Chapter Summary:

As Nehemiah neared the completion of Jerusalem's wall, opposition intensified—not with weapons, but with subtle schemes. Sanballat and Geshem invited him to meet on neutral ground. It sounded diplomatic, but Nehemiah saw through it.

Nehemiah 6:3 (ESV)

³ And I sent messengers to them, saying, "I am doing a great work and I cannot come down. Why should the work stop while I leave it and come down to you?"

This wasn't just a refusal—it was a declaration of purpose.

Nehemiah knew his calling and refused to be pulled away by distraction, manipulation, or fear. Deceptive rumors followed.

There were accusations of rebellion and pressure to hide. But Nehemiah stood firm, prayed boldly, and finished the work God had called him to.

Application:

- Practice Discernment: Not every opportunity is from God. Nehemiah saw through the invitation and stayed focused.
- Avoid distractions: Even good-sounding things can pull us from God's best. Nehemiah refused to be sidetracked.
- **Pray:** His strength came from short, honest prayers: "Now strengthen my hands." (v. 9)
- Live with Integrity: Nehemiah's refusal to compromise preserved both the mission and his witness.

Reflection Questions:

What "plain of Ono" invitations are trying to pull you away from your calling and/or the calling of KBC?

How are we as a church being tempted to compromise for comfort, approval, or ease?

How can you pray like Nehemiah—brief, bold, and honest—in moments of pressure?

What "great work" has God called you to that requires your full attention? What work has Jesus called us to as a church?
