QUESTION & ANSWERS OF THE MONTH

Question: Can I lose my salvation if I mess up?

★ WHY KIDS ASK THIS:

Children often worry when they make mistakes. If they say something mean, disobey a parent, or forget to pray, they might feel like they've disappointed God—and they may wonder if that means He stops loving them or takes away their salvation. This question comes from a place of wanting to stay close to God but also feeling unsure about His forgiveness.

★ HOW TO ANSWER:

When you put your faith in Jesus and ask Him to be your Savior, you are saved forever. God doesn't take that away every time you mess up. We all still sin sometimes, even after becoming Christians. That doesn't mean you stop being God's child.

Think of it this way: If you do something wrong, do your parents stop loving you or kick you out of the family? No way! They might correct you and help you make things right, but you are always their child. It's the same with God.

God's love is bigger than our mess-ups. When we sin, He wants us to confess it, turn away from it, and keep growing. But He never stops loving us or takes away our salvation. That's the gift of grace.

Truths to Emphasize

- Salvation is a gift, not something you earn and not something you lose, like a toy
- God's love is forever. He keeps His promises and doesn't change His mind
- We should take sin seriously but not live in fear. We confess, repent, and grow
