Day One

MARK 9:20- 24

# Pause:

I choose to participate with our pastors, staff and congregation in believing and praying together for God's will for us. Lord, I am committing to you today to pray and as my prayers join with our pastors, staff and congregation I believe you hear our prayers and that you will answer. Amen.

# Read:

So they brought him. When the spirit saw Jesus, it immediately threw the boy into a convulsion. He fell to the ground and rolled around, foaming at the mouth. Jesus asked the boy's father, how long has he been like this? From childhood, he answered. It has often thrown him into fire or water to kill him. But if you can do anything, take pity on us and help us. 'If you can'? said Jesus. Everything is possible for one who believes. Immediately the boy's father exclaimed, I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief! Mark 9:20- 24

**Consider:** A first century father was desperate to the point of tears for Jesus to care for his son as only Jesus could. He stood in the presence of Jesus admitting to having some measure of faith; but confessing there was a gap. He did not have one hundred percent confidence that Jesus could or would heal his son. And then he did something extraordinary – he invited Jesus to fill in the gap. Where his human faith was lacking, he invited Jesus to give more. Jesus responded to this vulnerable honesty. He unhesitatingly helped that man's unbelief and healed his son!

Ask:

Where in your life do you need to ask the Lord to fill the gap?

#### Prau:

Lord, we believe together for your will and resurrection presence to heal lives and build your church on earth as it is in heaven. Lord, I give you the measure of faith that I have today and invite you to fill me and all of us praying today with greater faith. Amen.

EPHESIANS 3:14-16

# Pause:

Father, help me to pause today and recount all the ways you have blessed me through our family of faith. Amen

## Read:

For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being. Ephesians 3:14-16

Consider: Even while Paul was imprisoned, he wanted to encourage believers by reminding them who they are in Christ. They are a family! A family empowered by the Spirit to work together for God's purpose. Jews were always known as the children of God, but now the promise of Jesus has been given to the Gentiles too. That's us. Paul is praying that they not only recognize and remember this gift, but they would understand the power that comes through this family. # Pray:



# Pause:

Think of a time someone encouraged you to see others as the Lord sees them. Did their encouragement cause you in turn to encourage others? Does the love you receive from God cause you to incite his love in your home? Your church? Your work and in the world?

# Read:

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Hebrews 10:23-24

Consider: There was an urgent knock on my door just after the hurricane. It was my neighbor Dave, a retired U.S. Army Colonel. He said two young hawks were violently blown from their nest during the hurricane and were laying in his yard. I wasn't sure why he crossed the street to tell me this and then I heard him say, "They need someone with compassion, so I knocked on your door!" Although I knew nothing about helping traumatized hawks, I jumped into action encouraged that he would turn to us for compassion. Immediately my heart felt flung in the direction of the Lord knowing all the love and compassion I could ever show is from Him alone. Grabbing small blankets, I followed Dave and located the baby hawks. They were face down, weak, but alive. Wrapping each in a blanket I cradled them in my arms after prying their strong talons from the grip they held to the ground. How could I help them? I felt inept to help until I remembered what Dave had sought from me - someone with compassion. I prayed out loud and watched as they perked up and began making hawk sounds. A few days later a male and female hawk came and sat on the wire above my head whenever I held the hawks outside. Eventually one baby hawk left with them! Those were just 2 little hawks. Now imagine people God brings into our lives - people tossed about in the storms of life. Imagine the impact if we profess Christ cling to him as if our life and theirs depend on it because they do!

Are you clinging to Jesus? Who will you encourage toward love and good deeds this week?

**Pray:** God, you created hawks with keen eyesight and ability to fly to great heights. Enhance the eyes of my heart to see the way you see. Lift my thoughts above the storms so that when someone needs encouragement, compassion and love, they will knock on my door. Amen

## Pause:

## Read:

# Read:

All the believers were together and had everything in common. Acts 2:44

#### Consider:

Can you imagine what a Covid world would have been like during the time of Jesus? As the Christian community began to come together and to grow, Covid hits and everyone has to stay at home. There was no internet, so no streaming services – literally no communication systems. I learned during that time in 2020 that I needed my community. There really was no Life. Better. Together. at least at the beginning of that ordeal. As we slowly began the journey of being able to worship together, that sense of comfort and support returned. Luke tells the story of people meeting together and sharing not only their faith but living out their faith by helping one another. Praise the Lord. The Holy Spirit is visibly at work at FMC, expectations give way to anticipation as our attention turns to and focuses on God.

Ask:

How are you following God's plan to Live in community, Invest in others, Focus outward, and Experience God?

**Pray:** Holy Spirit, we know you are always present, and we are confident in the journey coming before us. Please inspire us to share the Word of the Gospel with those whom we know but also to those we don't and who may be hungry for you. Encourage us to become invested in Life. Better. Together. at both campuses of FMC. Amen

# Day Seven

1 CORINTHIANS 1:10

#### Pause:

Lord, help me to identify any concerns and sources of anxiety. I surrender each one of these to you one at a time. Holy Spirit, guide this moment.

#### Read:

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought. 1 Corinthians 1:10

**Consider:** I grew up in a home that was riddled with conflict. Now it was not nuclear conflict, though sometimes that could be true. But conflict exists in a home with three boys, both parents working, and some difficult life circumstances. On a good day, at least one of us boys were trying to sabotage another. It would be hard for me to remember a time when ALL of us agreed with one another, with NO divisions, and PERFECTLY united in mind and thought. How could a community possibly live in to this command from the apostle Paul? In our church we have different political views, different ethnicities, different cultures, different languages, different socio-economic experiences, different stories, and different priorities. So, to think that we can achieve perfect unity, even for a second, sounds utopian.

Whether this command is meant to be an achievable reality or at least something to strive for, does not negate the validity of the importance of unity. And there is one catch in this passage; the whole command is through the premise that Jesus is in the center of the community. It is only possible with Jesus. The cross and resurrection is the uniting factor that crosses every divide. Jesus is the great equalizer that brings forgiveness for all and life for all. But it requires that our identity in Christ supersedes any other label, affiliation, culture, or disagreement.

Start small today: Who in your life do you have a disagreement with? Can you pray for them?

**Pray:** God, thank you that you have called us son and daughter. Help me to live in that identity today and to seek unity with others. Jesus, you have made a way for the family to live in unity and we ask that you continue to break down barriers of divide in our lives. Amen.

#### Pause:

Here are some things I prefer not to do by myself: make a bed, hang a picture, build a deck. None are impossible for one. I've done it. But Lord, show me the way to match my skills with the person who can make us your best witness and worker as a team.

# Read:

Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

#### Consider:

The writer seems to simply refer to companionship, either with friends, colleagues or marriage. Two equals more labor. Two equals help in trouble. Two equals warmth, defense; all logical and straightforward. Hey, look at bed-making, picture-hanging and deck building. Sensible. Better with two. And sometimes, physically, the road is steep, the materials heavy, the journey long (to continue a building analogy). God intends for us to work together for His Kingdom. It's not a solitary sport. Now, is there more here than the simplicity of pairs?

What of spiritual companionship? The spiritual companionship of another building the Kingdom of God along with you. Another praying for and about the work along with you; two praying for one another. Now consider the benefits. I think they more than double. Furthermore - and most importantly, the spiritual companionship of Christ. What more can I do - can we do? What better can I do if He is my companion? Is Christ not the most important man on the team?

Am I supporting my earthly companions in ministry? Am I leaning on those companions when the ministry gets tough?

# Pray:

Father, prepare me for the work of your kingdom. Show me where to build and let me grow in service to you as I grow in friendship, love and collaboration with others you have chosen to join in the building.













# Day Thirieen

ACTS 1.8

#### Pause:

Have you ever felt overwhelmed by the task of witnessing for Christ? Take a moment to pray, "Lord, fill me with Your Spirit today so I can be a bold witness for You."

#### Read:

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

#### Consider:

As Jesus prepared to ascend to heaven, He gave His disciples a mission: to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth. This mission might have seemed daunting to them, as it can to us today. 

# Read:

And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

#### Consider:

# Day Fifteen

JOHN 17:20-21

#### Pause:

The importance we give Christian unity seems to regularly fall short when we consider the way we live out our faith. Even those who call for unity often fail to present a convincing vision for what Christian unity looks like and resorting to a distant and symbolic "unity". Perhaps we need to be asking, "Why is Christian unity so important to God and His Kingdom?" and "What does it say about our faith and understanding when we lack unity?" # Read:

# Pause:

# Read:

I will establish my covenant as an everlasting covenant between me and you and your descendants after you for the generations to come, to be your God and the God of your descendants after you. Genesis 17:7

## Consider:

Recently, I helped my son learn to ride a bike. I had to keep encouraging him to believe in himself. He eventually got it and I love that we can now share in something that brings us both joy! In a similar yet more profound way, I bet that Abraham couldn't wait to share faith with his son. But God's promises to Abraham and Isaac were not for them alone. Passing down faith to the next generation doesn't happen automatically. It requires parents and mentors teaching, modeling, and championing their faith. Today there are powerful forces at work against our kids. When families and the Church believe in the next generation, they will be better equipped to experience the life-long joy of riding down the path of the Christian life.

his week we reflect on compassion towards others with a familiar passage. Consider what it might look like to read these words with a new heart. We give thanks for God's Word and pray that these words may become etched on our hearts and enable us to go out in the world to share with others. In the name of Jesus, we pray. Amen.

#### Read:

Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. John 3:14-17

Consider: Our scripture reading for today might be one of the most well-known scriptures to people around the world. But for many, the scripture verse that was memorized as a child does not always include verses 14-15. Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus, a Pharisee. In the same fashion that he usually did, he would use a story from the Old Testament that was familiar to His audience, one that they would recognize. Jesus reminds Nicodemus how God instructed Moses to create a bronze snake on a pole to be lifted high. When the Israelites looked up at the bronze snake, they would be healed. In the same way, Jesus says that He must be lifted up so that all who believe would have eternal life through Him. John 3:16 is perhaps one of God's greatest examples of compassion towards man. The fact that God would send His son to earth was because of His great love for us and His great desire for us to be with Him. This show of compassion is one that we should strive to reflect in our love for others and to guide our actions. Our love and compassion for others should be so great that we look past people's situations and outward appearances and see them as God sees them. When we believe and have a compassionate heart, together we are able to do far more than we could ever imagine for the kingdom of God here on earth.

Read the scripture above one more time. Do we hear these words with gratitude? Do we hear these words with a yearning that others might hear and believe?

**Pray:** Gracious and loving God, we are humbled and full of gratitude for the compassion and mercy You show us each day. We know that You desire for all of Your sons and daughters to be in relationship with You. May our hearts be opened to hear your Word and to show compassion to those who are hurting and in need. Help us to keep our eyes on Jesus and to lift Him up for others to see and believe. We ask all these things in the name of Your Son, Jesus. Amen.

He tells them that their gifts must reflect God's love or else they have no real meaning. God loved us so much that he gave his only son as a sacrifice for the sins of all people. There is no love greater than that. God's love is eternal, selfless and it is for all people, even the unlovable.

> How can you use your spiritual gifts to show God's love in the world and help strengthen His kingdom?

## Prau:

Hurt in life is unavoidable, but no pain is too deep or too widespread to lie beyond the power of God's love and forgiveness.

# Pray:

Let's meditate on that beautiful forgiveness and ask God to do that work through us. Lord, help us to do the supernatural here, and not the natural. Help us to show the same grace and mercy to others, that You give to us. # Read:

# Consider:

This story, told by Jesus, is not just a word of encouragement, it's a command. The master of the house has sent his servant out beyond the gates of the town to the people who had not received an invitation to his master's table. This servant had to put a lot of effort to reach these people. He had to do more than most others and he was happy to do it. And yet, why did the master send him? So that his house would be full. The master wants his house, his kingdom, to be filled with all people He won't rest until everyone has been reached.

**Consider:** After decades of persecution due to his bold actions spreading the gospel, Paul was again imprisoned in Rome. He was aware that he was soon to be martyred as he wrote the above scripture in what would be his last letter, 2 Timothy. Was his focus on his own interests or on wallowing in self-pity? Not in the slightest! Instead, he maintained an eternal perspective and let the Holy Spirit strengthen him and drive his actions. He kept the faith and encouraged the church to remain steadfast. Paul foretold that people would strive to deviate from sound doctrine to find a way to support their own sinful, worldly desires. This behavior and threat to sound doctrine continues today! As Paul saw the end of his earthly life nearing, he focused on the following priorities: persevering in service to the Lord, expanding the kingdom, and strengthening the church body, preparing it to fight against false doctrine. We should do the same, emphasizing Endurance, Evangelism and Encouragement!
