## eVisa

- eVisas are required for American citizens to enter Brazil after April 10, 2025
- If you already possess a valid physical Brazilian visa, you do not need to apply for a new one (Please make sure it is still in date)
- Apply for your visa a minimum of 45 days before departure to allow time for processing (especially for minors)
- eVisas are valid for up to 10 years
- There are two options to apply for your visa
  - 1. Brazil's official site: VFS Global <a href="https://brazil.vfsevisa.com/information">https://brazil.vfsevisa.com/information</a> Cost: is \$80.90
  - 2. A third-party group. We recommend IVISA. It is easy, but it will cost an extra \$70

- These Details below are for Brazil's official site, VFS Global (Read their Information page before you start)
  - Have the first three items uploaded as JPEGs (not PDFs) on your device before starting the
    process. If this already sounds too complex, save time and frustration by using the third-party
    option above. You can do everything on their app on your phone; they will then size and convert
    documents to the specifications you need.
  - **Passport**, signed, valid up to the end of your Brazil trip, two pages free, (some agents have required passports to be valid for at least 6 months after the return date), only the bio page is needed.
  - A Passport-Style Photo: You can try this on your phone by taking a headshot photo against a white
    wall with no glasses and ears showing. This is the leading cause of rejected applications, so please
    carefully read the photo guidelines on the VSF website. You can also get a visa photo made at
    Walgreens. Once you upload the photo as a JPEG, you will be able to crop it on the VSF website.
  - Flight Itinerary (JPEG): Go to <u>www.ManagedMissions.com</u> and find your flight info under "Documents." If your itinerary is not yet available, you can upload the same picture of the bio page of your passport again, in place of your flight itinerary
  - Date of your last trip to Brazil
  - o Contact in Brazil, see below the whole address will not fit on the application, add what you can
- You will be applying for a "Tourist" visa.
- Minors 17 and under will require extra documentation from both parents, which takes more time (for instance, you will need notarized release forms and original birth certificates)
- If you are not a U.S. citizen, you should research the entry requirements for your country.
- Once you receive your visa, you must print two copies and bring them with your passport (make an extra copy and take a photo on your phone for backup)
