Genesis 2:1-7

- 1. Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.
- 2. And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.
- 3. And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.
- 4. These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens,
- 5. And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground.
- 6. But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

Scripture:

Seas

Transliteration: yām Pronunciation: yawm

KJV Translation Count: sea (321x), west (47x), westward (21x), west side (4x), seafaring men (1x), south (1x), western (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: sea

1) the sea (the great basin in the temple court)

Scripture:

Genesis 1:10 - And God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he

Seas: and God saw that it was good.

Let (Wait)

Transliteration: *qāvâ* Pronunciation:

KJV Translation Count: wait (29x), look (13x), wait for (1x), look for (1x), gathered (1x), miscellaneous

(4x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: to wait, look for, hope, expect

Scripture:

Genesis 1:9-10 - And God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered [wait: qia'wu] together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land earth, and the gathering [collection: u'le'mikveh] of the waters He called seas; and God saw that it was good.

The Breath

Transliteration: rûaḥ Pronunciation: roo'-akh

KJV Translation Count: Spirit or spirit (232x), wind (92x), breath (27x), side (6x), mind (5x), blast (4x), vain (2x), air (1x), anger (1x), cool (1x), courage (1x), *miscellaneous* (6x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: wind, breath, mind, spirit

- 2) wind
 - a) of heaven
 - b) quarter (of wind), side
 - c) breath of air
 - d) air, gas
 - e) vain, empty thing
- spirit (of the living, breathing being in man and animals)

Scripture:

Genesis 1:2 - And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the **Spirit** of God moved upon the face of the waters.

Genesis 6:3 - And the LORD said, My **spirit** shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years.

Genesis 6:17 - And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein is the **breath** of life, from under heaven; and every thing that is in the earth shall

Nostrils

Transliteration: 'ap̄ Pronunciation: af

KJV Translation Count: anger (172x), wrath (42x), face (22x), nostrils (13x), nose (12x), angry (4x), longsuffering (4x), before (2x), countenance (1x), forbearing (1x), forehead (1x), snout (1x), worthy (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage:

- 1) nostril, nose, face
- 2) anger
- 3) Appayim means two noses meaning nostrils. The Hebrew way you say "nostrils" is "two noses" Ephesians 2:14-17 For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby: And came and preached peace to you which were afar off, and to them that were nigh.

Scripture:

Genesis 2:7 - And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his **nostrils** the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

Genesis 7:22 - All in whose **nostrils** was the breath of life, of all that was in the dry land, died.

Exodus 15:8 - And with the blast of thy **nostrils** the waters were gathered together, the floods stood upright as an heap, and the depths were congealed in the heart of the sea.

Job 4:9 - By the blast of God they perish, and by the breath of his **nostrils** are they consumed. Job 27:3 - All the while my breath is in me, and the spirit of God is in my **nostrils**;

Proverbs 30:33 - Surely the churning of milk bringeth forth butter, and the wringing of the **nose** bringeth forth blood: so the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife.

Flesh

Transliteration: bāśār Pronunciation: baw-sawr'

KJV Translation Count: flesh (256x), body (2x), fatfleshed (2x), leanfleshed (2x), kin (2x), leanfleshed (1x), mankind (1x), myself (1x), nakedness (1x), skin (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage:

1) the body itself

flesh as frail or erring (man against God)

Scripture:

Genesis 6:3 - And the Lord said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is **flesh**: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years.

Ephesians 2:14-17 - For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his **flesh** the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby: And came and preached peace to you which were afar off, and to them that were nigh.

Enemies

Transliteration: 'ōyēb Pronunciation: o-yabe'

KJV Translation Count: enemy(s) (280x), foes (2x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: (Qal) enemy

 personal national

Scripture:

Psalm 110:1 - The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine **enemies** thy footstool.

Luke 20:43 - Till I make thine enemies thy footstool.

Romans 5:10 - For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

Hebrews 1:13 - But to which of the angels said he at any time, Sit on my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool?

Footstool

Transliteration: $re\bar{g}el$ **Pronunciation**: reh'-gel

KJV Translation Count: feet (216x), footstool (6x), after (4x), times (4x), follow (4x), piss (2x), toes (2x), journey (1x), legs (1x), *miscellaneous* (7x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: foot

- 1) foot, leg
- 2) of God (anthropomorphic)
- 3) of seraphim, cherubim, idols, animals, table
- 4) according to the pace of (with prep)

three times (feet, paces)

Scripture:

- 1 Chronicles 28:2 Then David the king stood up upon his feet, and said, Hear me, my brethren, and my people: As for me, I had in mine heart to build an house of rest for the ark of the covenant of the Lord, and for the **footstool** of our God, and had made ready for the building:
- 1 Chronicles 9:18 And there were six steps to the throne, with a **footstool** of gold, which

were fastened to the throne, and stays on each side of the sitting place, and two lions standing by the stays:

Psalm 110:1 - The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy **footstool**.

Isaiah 66:1 - Thus saith the LORD, The heaven *is* my throne, and the earth *is* my **footstool**: where *is* the house that ye build unto me? and where *is* the place of my rest?

Lamentations 2:1 - How hath the Lord covered the daughter of Zion with a cloud in his anger, and cast down from heaven unto the earth the beauty of Israel, and remembered not his **footstool** in the day of his anger!

Savour

Transliteration: rêaḥ Pronunciation: ray'-akh

KJV Translation Count: savour (45x), smell (11x), scent (2x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: scent, fragrance, aroma, odour

1) Scent, odour

Odour of soothing (technical term for sacrifice to God)

Scripture:

Genesis 8:21 - And the Lord smelled a sweet **savour**; and the Lord said in his heart, I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; for the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth; neither will I again smite any more every thing living, as I have done.

Rock Water

Transliteration: şûr Pronunciation: tsoor

KJV Translation Count: rock (64x), strength (5x), sharp (2x), God (2x), beauty (1x), edge (1x), stones (1x), mighty One (1x), strong (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: rock (of God)

Scripture:

Exodus 17:6 - Behold, I will stand before thee there upon the **rock** in Horeb; and thou shalt smite the **rock**, and there shall come **water** out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel.

Numbers 20:8 - Take the rod, and gather thou the assembly together, thou, and Aaron thy brother, and speak ye unto the **rock** before their eyes; and it shall give forth his **water**, and thou shalt bring forth to them **water** out of the **rock**: so thou shalt give the congregation and their beasts drink.

Tithe

Transliteration: *maʿaśēr* **Pronunciation**: mah-as-ayr'

KJV Translation Count: tithe (27x), tenth part (2x), tenth (2x), tithing (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage: tithe, tenth part

1. Tenth part

Tithe, payment of a tenth part

Scripture:

Genesis 14:19-20 - And he blessed him, and said, Blessed be Abram of the most high God,

possessor of heaven and earth: And blessed be the most high God, which hath delivered thine enemies into thy hand. And he gave him **tithes** of all.

Hebrews 7:1-10 - For this Melchisedec, king of Salem, priest of the most high God, who met Abraham returning from the slaughter of the kings, and blessed him;

- 2 To whom also Abraham gave a **tenth part** of all; first being by interpretation King of righteousness, and after that also King of Salem, which is, King of peace;
- 3 Without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor end of life; but made like unto the Son of God; abideth a priest continually.
- 4 Now consider how great this man was, unto whom even the patriarch Abraham gave **the tenth** of the spoils.
- 5 And verily they that are of the sons of Levi, who receive the office of the priesthood, have a commandment to take **tithes** of the people according to the law, that is, of their brethren, though they come out of the loins of Abraham:
- 6 But he whose descent is not counted from them received **tithes** of Abraham, and blessed him that had the promises.
- 7 And without all contradiction the less is blessed of the better.
- 8 And here men that die receive **tithes**; but there he receiveth them, of whom it is witnessed that he liveth.
- 9 And as I may so say, Levi also, who receiveth **tithes**, payed **tithes** in Abraham.
- 10 For he was yet in the loins of his father, when Melchisedec met him.

Righteousness

Transliteration: ṣ*a* dāqâ tsed-aw-kaw'

KJV Translation Count: righteousness (128x), justice (15x), right (9x), righteous acts (3x), moderately (1x), righteously (1x).

Outline of Biblical Usage:

- 1) righteousness (of God's attribute)
- 2) righteousness (in a case or cause)
- 3) righteousness, truthfulness
- 4) righteousness (as ethically right)
- 5) righteousness (as vindicated), justification, salvation
 - a) of God

prosperity (of people)

Scripture:

Genesis 15:6 - And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

Galatians 2:21 - I do not frustrate the grace **of God**: for if **righteousness** come by the law, then **Christ** is dead in vain.

Philippians 3:9 - And be found in him, not having mine own **righteousness**, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of **Christ**, the righteousness which is **of God** by faith:
