-CONSISTORY MEETING SUMMARY-

November 11, 2025

Devotions and prayer were offered by Mike, reading from James 1:5, speaking of wisdom and humility in leadership, always seeking and being open to God's will.

Financial Report: The deacons provided the October financial report and shared that the offerings for the Mission Conference totaled 20,470.25, Praise the Lord! Also, the offering at the Thanksgiving Eve service will be designated for Love Inc. ministry.

The Ministry Team Reports were reviewed by all members prior to the meeting and discussion followed as needed.

Ongoing Ministry/Business: Ministry Teams for 2026 were discussed, the Harvest Network has quarterly Zoom meetings and a yearly conference, the Executive Team has recommended that at least one consistory member join in on these meetings, to process and assist Pastor Kathy in sharing the resources available within the network.

An update was given from the Congregational Celebration that was held on November 2, we welcome, Greg Buning and Rick Kars as Elders - Cainen Gilde and Holly Mulder as Deacons. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend a Rehoboth Vision Prayer Gathering that will be held on Tuesday morning, November 18, from 8:00 am – 9:00 am, at Reedy's Restaurant.

New Business: Pastor Kathy, Troy and Barb have met and drafted A Vision Fulfillment Plan that will assist all Rehoboth Ministry Teams to include the Rehoboth Vision in their 2026 planning.

At this time, Pastor Kathy recused herself and Pastor Ben remotely joined the meeting, as each Consistory member worked together to form the Pastoral Search Committee, after open discussion, eight candidates will be sent letters and some alternates were selected. Each candidate will be contacted by a Consistory member about their willingness to serve. At the December meeting, one Elder and one deacon will be selected as team members. A subcommittee was created to complete the Pastoral Profile, this will be shared at the December Consistory Meeting. Pastor Ben shared his thoughts as we move forward after the Pastoral Search Team is completed.

Mark closed the meeting with prayer.
