<u>10/25/25</u>: **Pastor Dave McMahon** has had a setback. His words sent on 10/24: "I've had a recurrence of the C-Diff Bacterial infection identified yesterday. Waiting for a different hi-potency antibiotic that was created for this infection. Somewhat depressing, even though I was warned of it's possibility of returning. This means that Chemo will be set back several weeks until this infection is cured. Thanks." Please keep Pastor Dave in your prayers.

<u>10/26/25</u>: Family Update on **Colter Bailey**: "Colter's stem cell transplant was Friday the 24th. The transplant itself went well! Colters blood counts will continue to drop the next few days. He will receive blood product transfusions to help him recover until his counts start to come up on their own and when the new stem cells and bone marrow start producing. In the next week or so Colter will have little to no immunity and is at risk for secondary infections and viruses, along with mucuocitis. We hope and pray none of these things occur. Once his counts are high enough and he can eat and drink on his own, we should be able to go home!" Please continue to pray for Colter and his entire family.

<u>10/28/25</u>: Please be in prayer for **Bruce and Lisa DeBoer's daughter Cortni**. Cortni was recently diagnosed with papillary thyroid carcinoma. The good news is that thyroid cancer generally has a very good prognosis. She will be undergoing surgery (yet to be scheduled) to have her thyroid completely removed, followed by radioactive iodine treatments to treat any nearby affected tissues. After surgery, it will then be a process of going through hormone replacement therapy to figure out the right dosage. The recovery process can take anywhere from 4 - 6 months as she recovers from surgery and radiation and they work to regulate her hormones.
