Participants, called "investigators", are guided through an assessment of their own resources and how to build those resources as part of the move toward self-sufficiency. Getting Ahead puts the concepts, tools and relationships in the hands of people in poverty to make a difference in their own lives and in the life of their community.

In continued support of the Getting Ahead program and during several 16-week groups or "Cohorts", All Saints will provide complete meals (entrees, snacks, salads, desserts, etc.), serve the meals, and fix leftovers in take-away containers. Last year All Saints provided meals to thirty-two (32) people to include Investigators, their children, the program facilitators and childcare providers.
