5. What is meant by the cross being “folly to postmodern minds”?
6. What does the idea of Christians “embracing the shame of the cross” mean”?
7. Why is Pontius Pilate the only other person besides Jesus and Mary named in the Apostles’ Creed?
8. What does Jesus’ death do for us and how does his death change our standing before God?
9. What does the idea of “cruciformity” mean for how believers live out their faith?
