

# Discussion Guide

## **Opening Activity:**

Ask each person to share one area of life right now where they feel God has placed them to make a difference—at work, in their family, neighborhood, school, or friendships. Encourage them to briefly describe why they think God has positioned them there in this season.

**Read:** Nehemiah 3:1-31; Nehemiah 6:15

## **Discussion Questions:**

1. God calls ordinary people with ordinary skills to do extraordinary Kingdom work (Nehemiah 3:1, 8, 12; 1 Corinthians 1:26-29). How does this encourage you about your own role in God's work?
2. Your section is significant, no matter its size (Nehemiah 3:1-32; Matthew 25:21). How can comparison distract us from faithfully building what God has entrusted to us?
3. Faithful work in your section contributes to God's greater plan (Nehemiah 3:1-32; 1 Corinthians 12:4-7). How can we keep sight of the bigger picture when our section feels small or hidden?
4. God's favor accelerates and multiplies faithful work—the wall was rebuilt in 52 days (Nehemiah 6:15; Proverbs 16:3). Where have you seen God multiply your efforts in unexpected ways?
5. The work belongs to God, and the success comes from Him (Psalm 127:1; Ephesians 2:10). How does this truth free you from pressure and striving?
6. Share a story about a time when you were part of a team project—how did your unique role help the group succeed?
7. If God wrote your “section of the wall” in a book today, what would it say you are building?
8. How can we help each other persevere when building our section feels tiring or slow?
9. Have you ever underestimated the Kingdom value of something small you did? What happened later that showed it mattered?
10. Who has “built into” your life in a way that helped you grow in faith? How can you thank or honor them this week?

## **Challenge for the Week:**

This week, identify one specific action step you can take to build your section of God's Kingdom—whether that's encouraging someone, starting a conversation about faith, serving in a new way, or investing deeper in a relationship God has placed in your life. Before you leave your group today, share your action step with one other person in the group and exchange contact information. Commit to checking in with each other by midweek to see how it's going and to pray for one another's faithfulness in completing it. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10; Hebrews 10:24-25)
