FIRST READING - **Genesis 32:22-31**

Caleb Kragelend, Camp Saint Andrew's

Our Hebrew Bible reading tells how Jacob, on the night before his confrontation with his brother Esau, wrestles all night with a man he comes to recognize as God.

Jacob took his whole family across the river with him, but slept alone on the other side. In the middle of the night a man wrestled with him until the early morning and injured Jacob's hip. Finally the man said to Jacob, "Let go of me, the sun is coming up." Jacob said, "I won't let you go until you give me your blessing." When the man asked his name, Jacob said, "My name is Jacob. "Then the man said, "From now on your name will be Israel, because you've been fighting all your life with people and with God, and you always win. "Then Jacob asked him, "Tell me who you are." The man wouldn't tell him but blessed him. So Jacob said, "This is unbelievable. I have seen face to face, and yet I'm still alive." And the sun came up, but Jacob was left with a limp because his hip had been injured.

THE GOSPEL – **Matthew 14:13-21** *All standing, as able*
Our gospel is the story of Jesus' feeding of over five thousand persons.

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.
People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Jesus took a boat to his favorite place where he could be by himself for a while. When the crowds found out where he was, they ran from the towns to see him when he came ashore. When he got off the boat, and saw the huge crowds, his heart ached for them. So he stayed with them and cured the sick people in the crowd. When it got to be evening, the disciples came to Jesus and said, "We're in the middle of nowhere. It's late. Send all those people away so they can go into town and buy themselves some supper." Jesus said, "We're not going to send them away. Give them something to eat." "Something to eat? All we have is five loaves of bread and two little fish!" Jesus said, "Bring me what you've got." Jesus told the crowds to sit down on the grass. He took the five loaves and two fish, and blessed the bread as he looked up to heaven. Then he broke the loaves into little pieces, gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. Everybody ate their fill; they filled up twelve baskets full of the leftovers. There were about five thousand hungry men there that day, not counting the women and the children that were with them. And every one of them had more than enough to eat.

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The congregation remains standing, as able.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

**We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory;**



And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Blessed Andrew and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation. 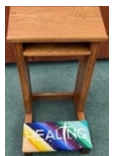
