Introduction

This reading plan will guide you through the entire Bible chronologically in one year. Each week includes six daily readings and one grace day for rest, reflection, or catch-up. Read prayerfully and use the SOAP method to further study each day's scripture.

Tips for Reading the Bible

Ask God to Speak to You

Reading the Bible isn't just informative. It is transformative. Ask God to speak to you by His Spirit through His word as you read. Ask God to give you ears to hear what He wants to say to you.

Don't Rush

It's easy to read too much or too fast. Take it slow and think about what you are reading. Take time to ask yourself two questions:

1. What is this passage saying?
2. Why do I need to know it?

Write it Down

Write down the things that seem to "pop" as you read. Use the S.O.A.P. acronym to guide your writing.

S - Scripture. What verse grabs your attention?

O - Observation. What did this mean to the original audience?

A - Application. What does this mean for you now?

P - Prayer. Write a prayer based on what God is saying through the passage.

Week 1 (Jan 1-7) – In the Beginning

Theme:

God reveals Himself as the Creator who brings order, beauty, and purpose into the world, and even as humanity falls, His sustaining grace and redemptive plan begin to unfold.

Psalm 137:5-6 (ESV) - "If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand forget its skill! Let my tongue stick to the roof of my mouth, if I do not remember you, if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy!"
