"Busted!"

The March Madness tournament is right around the corner. Who will win and who will lose? By the look of things, it may look like another strong year for the South Carolina Women's team since, as I write this, they are still undefeated. But the Men's Division - who knows? Maybe UConn, or Purdue, or even Marquette will push forward in the tournament.

Every year during March Madness, people fill our brackets attempting to pick the winner. Last year, hardly anyone predicted the men's bracket correctly since the top three seeds did

not make the Final Four. In fact, only 6 people supposedly picked the Final Four correctly. The rest of us? Our bracket was busted as our predicted winners kept getting beat. Busted! So much for predicting the future.

Similarly, in Psalm 130, the Psalmist seems to be in utter despair. He recognizes his sin and is overwhelmed by the misery and guilt. He says, *"Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord! O Lord, hear my voice! Let your ear be attentive to the voice of my pleas for mercy."* We may speak of depression or being down when we feel the guilt

and weight of our sin. The Hebrew that this Psalm was originally written in is even more descriptive. It has the connotation of drowning, being overwhelmed, and sinking into the depths of the sea from the weight of the sin.

Yet, as the author realizes that God does hear his pleas and grants him full forgiveness for the sins that weigh and drag him down, his darkness slowly gives way to light and the hope of the plentiful redemption of God. In fact, the last verse of Psalm 130 says, *"O*

Israel, hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with him is plentiful redemption. And he will redeem Israel for all his iniquities. (vs. 7-8)" This was written approximately 1,000 years before it came true. It was a prophecy: a prediction, a promise. The footnote in my Concordia Study Bible states this about verse 8: "from all their sins. From the root of trouble—but also from all its consequences. This greatest of all hopes has been fulfilled in Christ."

Ever since Adam and Eve, the root of all trouble has been sin. They introduced sin by their actions. They broke God's direction. They hid from God. They hid in their nakedness. And when confronted by God, they blamed God, each other, and the serpent. Adam and Eve faced consequences. They were sent out of the garden to wander the earth in their sin. The serpent was told by God that he would "eat dust." Busted! That is about as low and humiliating as one can get: eating dust. Sin brought death and defeat. But God did not leave his people without a promise of hope. Before Adam and Eve were sent out of the garden, God said, "*I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall crush his head, and you shall strike his heel.* (Gen 3:15 NIV)" The consequences of sin besides death are all the troubles of life brings, whether it be sickness, broken relationships,

disappointment, worry, and so on.

"He will redeem Israel." Prophecy made! Promise kept! Jesus did come. The Son of God, in His divine love for mankind, willingly took on our human nature, becoming like us in every aspect, yet without sin. By His own will, He came down from heaven, where He had been with the Father before the creation of the world. Christ not just took upon Himself the form of man but assumed the role of a servant. His entire earthly life was an existence of destitution and languishing. And it all led to the cross. It led to suffering and death.

The reason we go through Holy Week is to process what Jesus did to redeem us. The Apostle John wrote: "*The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.*" (1 John 3:8) Jesus had to suffer because someone had to pay for our sins. We should have paid, but Jesus did it for us... He did it to redeem us with His "holy precious blood, innocent suffering and death that I may be His own." Because "God so loved the world."

His effort ended with victory on Easter Sunday by Jesus' resurrection from the tomb. Through faith, we are winners! Salvation is ours on the back of Jesus! The consequence of sin is death, but the result of the resurrection of Jesus is eternal life for all who believe in Him. He has come to make peace between


God and man! He has come for you!

The writer of Psalm 130 made a prediction and promise, and he was correct: Jesus redeemed Israel and He redeems us. Even though sin "busted "us, we win through Jesus! We keep trying to fill out the perfect bracket with our lives in our efforts and achievements, but we always come up short. The good news is Jesus came and did it all for us! It means we can look at the consequences of sin and then look at the cross of Christ and peer into the empty tomb knowing that everything is going to be alright. Jesus loved us! Jesus loves you. Thanks be to God! Celebrate that Christ is Risen!

Impact Tomorrow Today Campaign Update

Impact. Such a strong and powerful word. It means "to have a significant or major effect." It was intentionally chosen as part of our current capital campaign because it is exactly what we need to do: **impact** the future of Sheboygan Lutheran High by retiring the construction loan of the Performing Arts Center. And yet, this is more than debt reduction. It is an essential endeavor for the financial health of the school, the protection of our endowment (which provides tuition assistance to families in need), and the execution of our mission to prepare the future generation of Christian leaders.

With a total cost of \$10M, we raised nearly half of the money between 2018-2022 during campaign #1, *Preparing for the Future*. Campaign #2, *Impact Tomorrow Today*, just kicked off in late August 2023, and as of January 31, we have received over \$230,000, with an additional \$215,000 pledged, bringing the *Impact* total to \$445,000 and counting.

The countdown to September 2025 is ON. That is when we will have the misfortune of relinquishing our sweet 3.95% interest rate for a larger one. Every dollar received before that time is one on which we won't have to pay a higher interest rate. We are asking our entire Lutheran family to stretch a bit on our behalf and consider a pledge to help us get closer to the finish line!



January 22, 2024 Church Council Meeting Minutes

Children's Ministry Update: Savannah Henn reported that AWANA has 62 children with 32 volunteers. Sunday School has 90 children. Both ministries are going very well. VBS went very well last summer, with over half the kids being non-members. VBS will be held again this summer, July 21-24. Savannah works closely with Nicole to plan out Family Events throughout the year, which have great attendance. The nursery had two staff member changes this past summer, but otherwise everything is going well. Savannah is in the process of getting her DCM license so that she can be a called worker.

The Gathering Place Update: Leah Zehel reported that census remains full. Two days the could take more participants, but cannot due to lack of volunteers. There are several snow birds which makes the winter months more difficult for volunteer coverage. Memory Matters has grown a little recently. The November Giving Campaign was a success and their goal of \$45,000 was met! The Soup Cook-off will be March 3, please spread the word.

Columbarium: In 2019 a team was assembled to determine if our church could have a Columbarium and if so, should they. At the time it was determined that yes, our church could legally have one and it would even be financially beneficial. Informational sessions were held for the Congregation. There was some pushback in regards to the chosen location. Then Covid happened, followed by a challenging parking lot project, so the Columbarium was tabled for quite a while. Various Congregation members continue to ask if this project will be resurrected. If so, a committee will need to be formed and much of the information will need to be reworked as it is 5 years old. Discussion was held and the Council decided to again pursue this project. Donna Felch agreed to chair the committee again and reach out to the former members, in conjunction with Pr Kyle, to form a committee.

Policy #48 – Church Council & Organization Chart:

Revisions were made to this policy to allow for a more accurate representation of installation. It also now details that the Executive Team is responsible for staff compensation and

the Senior Pastor annual performance review. An updated Organization Chart was also approved. Both can be found on the church website.

Senior Pastor Report: Pr Kyle reviewed potential policy changes to policies 46, 47 & 50. In order to make these changes, the Congregation will need to approve changes to the Constitution & Bylaws, indicating that there will no longer be an election for Church Council members, rather the candidate slate will be prepared by the Nominating Committee and presented to the Congregation for approval. The Head Elder will also no longer be an elected position with a two year term, but rather an appointment, just like the Treasurer position. Potential updates to the Constitution & Bylaws will be made and the Council will discuss at their February Meeting. Changes to policies 46, 47 & 50 will be tabled until after the April Congregation Meeting.

Book Study: Pr Kyle continued to lead the Council through their book study.

Savannah Henn Call: Savannah is currently taking classes to finish her degree, which will allow us to Call her. This will be recommended to the Congregation at the April Meeting.

10 Year Anniversary: Thank you was extended to Donna Felch for serving as our Church Treasurer for 10 years!
