“Remember”

It was first observed on May 30th, 1868, and for decades was celebrated on that date after General John A. Logan, the leader of the Grand Army of the Republic for Northern Civil war veterans, had called for a National Day of Remembrance.

In 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, to give federal employees more three-day weekends throughout the year. Since then, (if you haven't figured it out already) Memorial Day has been celebrated on the last Monday in May and was declared a federal holiday in 1971.

Memorial Day is a time for remembering the people who died while serving in our country's nation armed forces: securing our freedom

and then protecting it over the years. It was originally called Decoration Day as it was a day for the nation to decorate the graves of those who gave their lives fighting for our country. Today Memorial Day is seen as a time to honor all Americans who died while serving our nation. We owe them a debt of gratitude because it is their service and sacrifice that allow us to be a free people.

Memorial Day always reminds me of a few things. First, it was a special day that I got to spend with my grandfather when I was growing up. For years, I would get to go to the Plymouth Parade and watch my grandfather march in the parade as commander and eventually chaplain of the VFW Post in Plymouth.

Those were proud moments. After the parade, we would march to the cemetery and listen to the speakers talk about the cost of freedom and the stories of great men and women who gave their lives in defense of our country. I would hear the 21-gun salute and to this day, it is still very moving for me. We would then spend the day around the VFW post and helped my grandfather with any duties that he had. I cherish those memories.

Memorial Day also reminds me of something beyond our country and the men and women who gave their lives, and more significant than the parades and cookouts. Memorial Day reminds me of an even greater fight for our freedom that Jesus has secured for us

through His death and resurrection. He has won the victory over sin, death, and the power of the devil for you and me. Luke tells us how Jesus at the Passover Seder instituted the Lord's Supper for us. ".... And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' "(Luke 22:19)

The great battle for our freedom from sin was about to take center stage. God's plan of redemption was coming to its climax. It was so intense that the Gospel writers share some important details with us.

"...And he (Jesus) withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed, saying, "Father, if you are willing remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done.' " (Luke 22:41-42)

"Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour...And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the

earth shook, and the rocks were split. The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised, and coming out of the tombs after his resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many." (Matthew 27:45, 50-52)

*"Now after the Sabbath, town the dawn of the first day of the week...and behold there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it... 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, he has risen, as he said. **Come**, see the place where he lay."* (Matthew 28:1-6)

Memorial Day essentially kicks off the start of summer. School will be wrapping up shortly in a few weeks, the weather becomes warmer, and here in Wisconsin, we enjoy the outdoors while we can. But we should heed the words of the angel. It is important even in the midst of our summer schedules to "**Come**." We need to be fed the true spiritual food that helps us to grow in our faith by receiving the word and the Lord's Supper.

As we transition into our summer worship schedule starting on May 27 to two services on Sunday at 8:00 and 9:30 am (Thursdays remain the same), do not forget that we have an amazing opportunity. We can come, remember, receive His blessings, and continue to grow in our faith throughout the Summer.

March & April 2024 Church Council Meeting Minutes

March 2024 Meeting Minutes

Worship Ministry Update: Thomas Kelly (media) is assisting Thomas with worship slides while he plans, organizes and prints order of service, freeing up time to plan further ahead. The Bell Choir/Church Choir combination on Palm Sunday was well received. Thomas would like to do additional combinations going forward. Summer planning is underway for both usher and audio/visual team schedules.

Constitution & Bylaw Update: After further discussion of a potential process change in how Council members are chosen, a decision was made to present at the April congregational meeting background and information regarding an alternative approach being used by some LCMS churches. Member input will be invited subsequent to the meeting. Such input will be utilized by the Council when it considers whether to pursue the alternative process. As the Elder team is an advisory team, the Council continues to support a Constitution & Bylaw change to make the Head Elder an appointed position.

Senior Pastor Report: Pr. Kyle has a full schedule in this Holy Week. He gave the Council a quarterly update on membership changes. He has begun to monitor closely members who have recently stopped attending in person.

April 2024 Meeting Minutes

Associate Pastor Ministry Update: Pr Rob shared various activities and ministries that he is part of, including the Trinity Lutheran School Accreditation Review Team, Love Inc and Jail Ministry. He's also working on making some changes to our Bereavement Ministry and the Young Adult Group.

Activity Sponsorship Request: The Council approved St. Paul Friends request to hold Trash N Treasure on September 21, 2024.

Elder Team Update: The Elders spent time in prayer and devotion. They also discuss the role of Elders further, as providing prayer and spiritual support for the Pastors and staff. Three Elders have stepped down, at present they will not add any additional Elders, 5 remain.

Senior Pastor Report: Confirmation testing will be starting soon. Pr Kyle will be attending PLI in May. Pr Rob would like to start attending PLI, which is a two-and-a-half-year program. The Siebert Foundation will cover 75% of the cost, the Council agreed to budget for the remaining costs so that Pr Rob can attend.

Walk In Item – Newsletter/Designated Donations: Discussion was held following the congregation meeting. A staff member will follow up.

Walk In Item – Carillon & Bell During Worship: Discussion was held following the congregation meeting regarding the Carillon. A staff member will follow up.

The soundboard software was recently upgraded and there is a possibility we could add the bell microphone back. Further research will be done.

Walk In Item – Columbarium: Meetings have started and they are working on updating pricing.

Walk In Item – Cemetery Plots: Our church still owns two cemetery plots that were donated to us. We have been unable to find anyone to use in at least ten years. Stefanie will contact the cemetery and Wenig Funeral Home to let them know we'd be willing to donate them to someone in need.

April 2024 Congregation Meeting

Savannah Henn Call: Savannah was hired in August 2022. At the time her educational classification did not allow for a call. She has now been taking classes for the Director of Church Ministries Certificate. In July she will complete the certificate and will be able to accept a call. The Congregation voted to extend a call.

Constitution & Bylaw Update: The Congregation approved a recommendation from the Council that would make the Head Elder position appointed, as opposed to elected. The relationship between the Senior Pastor and the Head Elder is very important. They can have differences in opinion but need to be able to communicate well and support each other. This change would allow for that to happen. The Executive Team would then be responsible for the Senior Pastor's performance review, to ensure there isn't a conflict. The Elder Team will also serve in an advisory role to the Church Council as opposed to being able to create policy, which has created conflict in the past. Discussion was held.

Potential Policy Change Discussion: The Church Council is currently discussing a potential change to the Church Council election process as follows:

Current process

- President selects nominating committee
- Nominating committee identifies potential council members
 - Usually about 20 candidates
 - Pastor included in vetting process once potential candidates identified
- Nominating committee ranks candidates
- Nominating committee calls candidates to ask if they will be on ballot
 - Target is 2x number of open positions
- Open call to the Congregation for council nominations
- Ballot brought to voters meeting for election

Possible future process

- Open call for nominating committee members
 - Committee makeup finalized by council (6 max)
- Open call to the Congregation for council nominations
- Nominating committee performs formal interview process
 - Using questions developed by council
- Nominating committee ranks candidates and chooses new council members
- New council members brought to voters meeting for ratification

Congregation Concerns:

- **Why are birthdays, anniversaries, and the monthly calendar no longer printed in the newsletter?** This was the source of many complaints to the church office. Many people did not want their birthdays or anniversaries printed and there is no way for us to reasonably keep track of that information. At times information was incorrect due to divorces and deaths that were not reported to the office, which caused many issues. If someone would like a listing printed, they can contact the church office and we'd be happy to supply one.

As for the calendar, the publishing deadlines are so early, that often the information in the calendar was no longer correct. This caused people to come to events that had been changed, creating frustration. We have been working hard to improve the calendar on our website for this information as it is more real time. There have been glitches, but we continue to enhance it. We are also looking at new software to better integrate all of our systems.

- **Why is the newsletter now black and white?** We changed printing companies as they were no longer able to sell ads to cover the cost of the newsletter, in the past we paid nothing for it. Now we do have to pay for printing and color is double the cost. To be good stewards of the money God has entrusted in us, it will be printed in black and white. The online version is still in color.

- **Since the Council is discussing policy, it was suggested that they also talk about term limits and if anything should be changed in that regard.**
- **A congregation member would like to see us get a carillon, which would play music outside of the church, like we had at our old church. They would also like to see the bell used during worship for the Lord's Prayer and during funerals, like it had been years ago.**
- **Tom Witt shared a Lutheran High update. If anyone has any questions, feel free to contact him. He is an advocate.**
