SHARING IN THE GLORY OF GOD | JUNE 28, 2026

SERMON RECAP

God is exceedingly glorious and majestic, and compared to Him, we are so insignificant. Yet in Christ, the redeemed are made exceedingly glorious – which is how David, even as a sinner, could be called a man after God's own heart.

THE LEAD IN

- Have you ever been in a long season of waiting – for a job, a relationship, a child, or healing – when you couldn't see God working? Looking back, what did that season do in you?

GETTING INTO THE TEXT

- Read Psalm 8. David opens and closes with the same line about God's majesty. What does he see in the heavens that moves him to worship, and what does he discover about man's place in God's creation?
- Hebrews 2:5-11 quotes Psalm 8 and points it to Jesus, who was made "lower than the angels" yet crowned with glory. How does seeing Christ in this Psalm shape the way you read David's question, "What is man that you are mindful of him?"

GOING DEEPER

- Bob shared the Puritan John Trapp's description of us apart from Christ: "a mixture or compound of dirt and sin, and yet God is mindful of him." Where do you tend to look for your identity, and how does it change when you see yourself as both insignificant before God and exceedingly glorious in Christ?
- Bob pictured young David lying in the fields, gazing at the stars in awe of his Creator. What is it that most stirs awe of God's glory in you? This week, get outside, look up, and let His majesty move you to worship.

PRAYER

- As a group, spend time in praise and adoration of who God is. Behold His glory together, thank Him that in Christ your identity is secure, and recite back to Him – "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!"
