FOLLOW JESUS. NOTHING ELSE NEEDS SAID. | AUGUST 2, 2026

SERMON RECAP

Satan asked to sift Peter like wheat, but Jesus prayed that his faith would not fail. Peter's failure wasn't the end of his story—it became the foundation for a humbler, stronger faith that could strengthen others.

THE LEAD IN

- Share about a time you were confident you'd handle something well, only to fail at it. What did that reveal to you about yourself?

GETTING INTO THE TEXT

- Read Luke 22:31-34. Two requests are made. One from Satan, the other from Jesus. What does Satan ask permission to do, and how does Jesus respond on Peter's behalf?
- Read Luke 22:54-62. Peter's bold promise meets its test at the fire outside the high priest's house. What happens the moment the rooster crows, and why might that detail matter?

GOING DEEPER

- Tony pointed out that failure can be a great teacher, and repentance leads to new strength and perspective. Where has a past failure, once worked through, actually strengthened your walk with Christ?
- In John 21, Jesus restores Peter not with a lecture but with a question asked three times: "Do you love me?" and closed with the command: "Follow me." If Jesus asked you that same question today, how would you answer? And what would following him look like this week?

PRAYER

- Ask God for the humility to see where your own confidence outpaces your dependence on Him, and pray for the courage of Peter's restoration, to get back up and follow Jesus, wherever that leads.
