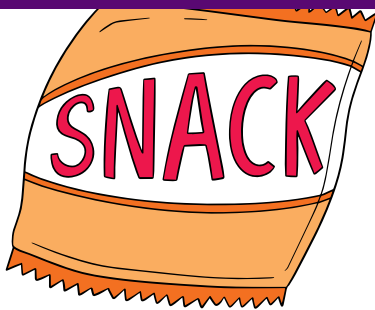

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Welcome to Kids Ministry!

Why do we have Kids Ministry? We know from Scripture that God's design is for parents to have the primary responsibility for discipling their children. So why do we have Kids Ministry?

Because discipleship doesn't happen in just one environment. God uses a variety of God-given influences to shape a child's faith. The home plays a primary role, and the church family comes alongside to encourage, support, and reinforce a growing faith. As children experience truth taught, modeled, and lived out in multiple environments, their faith is strengthened.

God never intended for families to walk the discipleship journey alone. He designed His people to live as a church family, encouraging one another and passing faith from one generation to the next. Children are a valued part of that family, and God often uses the influence of caring adults beyond their own home to encourage, teach, and model what it means to follow Jesus.

That is why we are committed to partnering with families as they nurture faith in the next generation!

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Our Heart for Ministry with Children

The vision and mission of LEFC is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We do this by sharing Christ in our relational worlds and pouring into the lives of others. We seek to be people who love God, love people, live truth, and proclaim Jesus. In our ministry with kids here at LEFC, we have the same mission, and we say it like this:

We are partnering with families to help kids know, love, follow, and share Jesus!

Our Values

At the heart of our Kids Ministry is a desire to follow God's heart in loving and investing in children and families. These values help clarify what matters most and guide how we serve—shaping our decisions, our environments, and our relationships as we seek to faithfully help children know, love, follow, and share Jesus.

We see this reflected in the following values:



GOD'S WORD

We value children understanding the Bible as one unified story—God's plan of redemption through Jesus.



SPIRITUAL FORMATION

We value giving children opportunities to encounter who God is and to practice the rhythms of faith that help them know and follow Him.



CHURCH FAMILY

We value children as a vital part of the body of Christ. Our ministry does not exist in isolation—it thrives within the life of our church family.



RELATIONSHIP & ACTIVE LEARNING

We value meaningful relationships and engaging, hands-on learning experiences as essential to how children grow and learn.



OIKOS

We value equipping children and families to live out and share the gospel in their everyday lives—where they live, learn, and play—both locally and globally. As part of this, we value helping children and families develop meaningful, prayerful connections with our global partners.



TEAMWORK

We value each person serving in Kids Ministry, recognizing that God uses their unique gifts to build His kingdom as we serve together.



PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS

We value partnering with parents and families, walking alongside them in the discipleship of their children.



SAFETY

We value creating environments where every child is safe, cared for, and known—both physically and emotionally.



Discipleship Pathway

Recognizing that spiritual formation takes place over time, we partner with families—knowing that children learn what they live, and that faith is formed and practiced in everyday life.

At the heart of our pathway is a simple desire: to help children know, love, follow, and share Jesus.

We see this take shape through the following pathway – not four steps in order, but one journey always in motion:

KNOW

Children grow in understanding of who God is and the story of His Word.

Welcome - Be known, welcomed, and learn to welcome others

Worship & Pray - Connect with and respond to God in worship and prayer

LOVE

Children experience belonging in the church family and develop a growing relationship with God.

Welcome — Be known, welcomed, and learn to welcome others

Worship & Pray — Connect with and respond to God in worship and prayer

FOLLOW

Children respond to God with faith expressed through obedience and love.

Respond — Recognize and follow God’s invitation in faith and obedience

Give — Develop a heart of generosity and love for others

SHARE

Children live on mission—sharing Jesus both here and around the world.

Share — Share the good news of Jesus with their oikos

Go — Engage in God’s global mission through prayer, support, and awareness

Classroom Names & Rosters

A friendly guide to our class names and groups for the new ministry year.

As Kids Ministry continues to grow, we're adding classes to keep groups **small and relational** — so every child can build real connections with their Shepherds and one another. As we move into the new ministry year, here are the class names and groups we'll be using.

Nursery & Preschool

Nursery Rooms A–F

 Room F will open as needed.



Rooms **A–C** are for infants and babies just learning to move on their own; **D–F** are for confident little walkers under age two. We have six nursery rooms — we'll start the year with five and open the sixth as needed, giving us flexibility to group our littlest ones by age, stage, and attendance.

Preschool Rooms A–F

 Room A will open in February; Room C will open as needed.



 Fall 2026 — Rooms B & D: 2's/3's.
Rooms E & F: 3's/4's.

Our preschool classes are for children who are **two or three year olds** when the year begins in September. Preschool classes are grouped by children who turned two by September 1 and those who turned three by September 1. Once a child is placed in a preschool class, they stay in that same class all year long — a two-year-old who turns three does not move up mid-year. The number of classes flexes with the year and attendance.

- 2 When a child turns two:** A child who turns two after September 1 will be promoted from the nursery to a preschool class once parents and Kids Ministry staff have confirmed they are ready to move.

! **Good to know:** These classes are based on each child's **current school grade or placement**, rather than age.

A balance of girls & boys

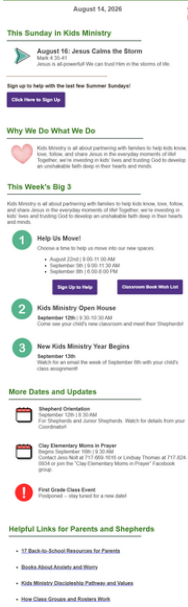
A mix of personalities

The people who lovingly and prayerfully invest in children here are called Shepherds. Our ministry with kids is powered by an amazing team of people who love Jesus, love kids, and have Pennsylvania background checks and clearances.

Safety & Security

Upon registering, parents/caregivers receive security tags for both parent and child. The Kids Ministry classroom area is a secure area. We also have trained security personnel monitoring our Kids Ministry classroom areas.



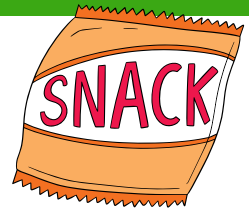
How We Contact Parents If Needed



If we need you to come check on your child, we will contact you by cell phone, usually by text message. This is the most efficient way to contact parents, no matter where they are in the building. So if your child is in Kids Ministry on Sunday, you'll just want to have your phone handy throughout the morning.

Allergies

We want to be very attentive to any allergies your child may have. Please make sure to include any allergy information for your child on their registration form or inform a member of our KidMin Staff or Family Welcome Team. Your child's allergy will be noted on their name tag.



Support for Special Needs



If your child has special needs or disabilities, we have a form for you to complete that helps us understand your child and his or her needs better. Whether your child would benefit from certain accommodations or having a one-to-one buddy, this form is a great start for us getting to know you and your child. Scan the QR code to access the form. You can hand the completed form in at the KidMin Welcome Desk on a Sunday morning, or you can give it to any member of our KidMin Staff. Then someone from our staff will be in touch with you.

Sunday Mornings

Children are seen, heard, and valued here at LEFC! Sunday morning classes with children are intentionally designed to be a safe place for children to actively learn and explore God's Word, and where children are loved and inspired by Shepherds who model what it's like to have a personal, everyday relationship with Jesus!

Nurseries

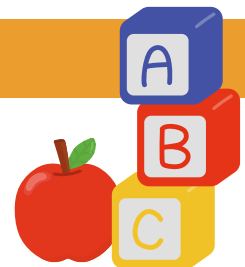
We have several nurseries for various developmental stages, from infants (at least 2 months old) up until 2 years of age. In our 1-year-old nurseries we focus on biblical themes using board books, conversation, songs, and prayer that is focused on a simple theme for each month.



- **My morning at church cards:** these are provided at parent drop off for you to indicate specific notes for your child's Shepherd [caregiver] regarding feeding, sleeping and other details.
- **Promotion in our nurseries:** our Nursery Coordinator will contact you when your child will be moving to the next nursery, or you may complete a "move up request" at the Welcome Desk and our Nursery Coordinator will follow up with you.
- **What to bring:** disposable diapers, bottle or sippy cup with your child's name on it, and a complete change of clothes. We provide cheerios to kiddos who are able to eat them. As an alternative, you are welcome to pack a specific snack for your children; we just ask that you communicate with your child's Shepherd about your child's specific snack. If they have a comfort item of some sort, that's good to bring, too!
- **Bottle/Cup Labels:** if your child's bottle or cup is not labeled, we have sticker labels that we will use on it. These labels are easily removed and will not leave residue.
- **Nursing Mom's Room:** Currently located just inside the Kids Ministry entrance (first door on the right), this room is a dedicated space for nursing moms that includes comfy chairs, a changing table, and access to the services via livestream.

Preschool (2- and 3-year-olds)

- **Bible, prayer & relationships:** we use a Christ-centered, Bible-based and developmentally appropriate curriculum which gives our very young children a strong foundation for beginning their journey of knowing, loving and following Jesus!



- **One service, two services, or both:** every Sunday we orient lessons around one Bible story, taught at both services. However, different games, activities, and crafts are used at each service to mix it up and make learning fun!
- **Memory verses:** children in this age group have memory verses to learn for each unit. The memory verse is listed each week in our Friday newsletter.
- **Songs & movement:** music, worship, and movement are provided during each class time.
- **Promotion:** once children are in a two's class or a three's class, they move or are promoted just one time a year. Our promotion is typically the Sunday after Labor Day weekend in the fall of each year.
- **What to bring:** a complete change of clothes. Optional: a labeled sippy cup. We provide Veggie Straws as a snack. As an alternative, you are welcome to pack a specific snack for your children; we just ask that you communicate with your child's Shepherd about your child's specific snack.

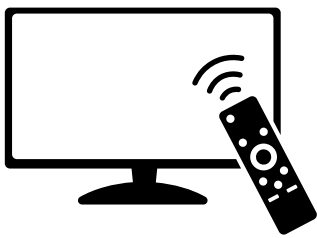
Pre-K Through 4th Grade



- **Bible, prayer & relationships:** we use a Christ-centered, chronological, and theologically rich curriculum called the Gospel Project that goes through the entire narrative of scripture over a span of 3 years. Our Coordinators customize and supplement the lessons to fit our ministry. The lessons are designed to teach the Bible, promote relationships, and provide hands-on opportunities for kids to process, practice, interact with, and internalize God's word and encounter God personally.
- **One service, two services, or both:** every Sunday we orient lessons around one Bible story, taught at both services. However, different games, activities, and crafts are used at each service to mix it up and making learning fun!
- **Memory Verses:** children in this age group have memory verses that go with the lessons [about every 3-4 weeks they have a new verse to work on memorizing]. The verses are listed in the Friday newsletter each week.
- **Large Group Story:** during the first service, children in K-4th Grade have a large group story time to engage with the Bible story of the day.
- **Kids Worship & World Mobilization Moments:** during the second service, children in Prek-4th Grade have a large group time for Kids Worship and World Mobilization Moments each Sunday! This is a time where we teach, encourage, and model for our children a heart for worship and what that looks like for kids!

- **Promotion:** children move to the next class/grade typically the Sunday after Labor Day weekend in the fall of each year.
- **What to bring:** when children are in 1st through 4th Grade, we especially encourage children to bring their Bibles with them to church. If your child does not have a Bible, let us know and we are happy to provide one. We provide Veggie Straws as a snack for our Pre-K through 4th Graders. As an alternative, you are welcome to pack a nut-free snack for your child. We ask that you communicate with your child's Shepherd regarding your child's specific snack.

Screen Time in Classrooms



In today's world, screens are all around us. Within Kids Ministry, we are intentional about keeping screen time limited and purposeful. Shepherds may occasionally choose to use a short video—typically two to three minutes—for review or interaction. Our lessons are not video-based; these brief videos simply complement the relational, hands-on learning that takes place in our classrooms.

Hands & Feet Ministry

We love kids at LEFC! And we want every child to feel welcome, valued and accepted as part of our church family. Our Hands and Feet Ministry is intentionally designed to come alongside children who benefit from support and encouragement from a one-to-one buddy. If you are wondering about having a buddy for your child, will you let us know? Just scan the QR code below to fill out the form. You can hand the completed form in at the KidMin Welcome Desk on a Sunday morning, or you can give it to any member of our KidMin Staff. Then someone from our staff will be in touch with you.



Michelle Bennett serves as our Hands and Feet Ministry Team Leader, as part of Kids Ministry. Her role is to get to know the kids who have a hands and feet buddy, and to support and equip those who serve as a buddy in this ministry. We are deeply grateful for Michelle's heart, experience, and education with children who have various special needs/disabilities.



The Oasis

The Oasis is a sensory breakout room designed for kids who benefit from a break from the classroom. It is an amazing blessing to have a space dedicated to investing in and ministering to kids whose unique needs are best met in a space that is intentionally designed to allow for movement, engagement, and individualized support.

To be clear, The Oasis is not a separate class but rather a breakout space where our Hands and Feet buddies can be with kids as needed.

The Wiggle Room



The Wiggle Room is a space created just for our preschoolers, two- and three-year-olds! We know that our two- and three-year-olds are naturally wired for movement and play! So, in addition to their interactive, hands-on Bible learning in the classroom, part of their schedule on Sundays will be to “visit” the Wiggle Room. We will get to use the Wiggle Room for WBF Kids as well as Recharge Kids too!

Children’s Offering



We know from Scripture that giving of our resources is part of our worship of God. We include “children’s offering” as a part of our ministry with children because learning to give generously, out of faith in God’s provision and a cheerful heart, is part of being a follower of Jesus.

Here are several Scriptures you can read together with your children to talk about giving generously: 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, Acts 20:35, 1 Corinthians 16:2, and James 2:16.

The children’s offering box is located on the wall just after the Kids Ministry Lounge as you walk into our Kids Ministry hallway. Throughout the 2026–2027 ministry year, our children’s offering will be given to bless our ten Global Partner Families adopted by Kids Ministry.



As a Kids Ministry, we have adopted 12 global partner families that we pray for, care for and support. All the global partners and their pictures are available in our Global Partner booklet. Each month during the year [September through June], we have a “global partner of the month” that we pray for in Kids Ministry on Sunday mornings. We invite you to join us during the week at home to pray for our global partner of the month! The global partner of the month is posted weekly in our Friday e-news and highlighted on the electronic posters in the hallways on Sunday mornings.

Why do we prioritize missions in our kids ministry? Why is it an important part of our Discipleship Pathway?

Jesus commanded His followers to "go and make disciples of all nations," and we want our children to grow up with hearts that embrace God's heart for the world. As our children build relationships with our global partner families—praying for them, encouraging them, learning about their lives and challenges, and learning about the people they serve—God's global mission becomes personal. Our prayer is that every child grows as an active participant in Jesus' mission of making disciples of all nations, as they discover their role in His mission.



“Friends From Afar”

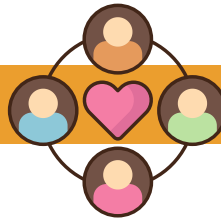
In our **Preschool - Kindergarten** classes, there is a portion of the lesson when kids learn and pray about the work of our Global Partner Families. We are teaching children that even though they may not see these Global Partners often, we can still be their friends! Each week features a new interactive activity introducing the culture that the family of the month lives in and the work that they are doing to share the love of Jesus with people in different countries. These activities may include games, crafts or videos. Each session will end with a short prayer to lead the children through to talk to God about our Global Partners. Because of certain security measures we must maintain for the safety of families living internationally, these activities will not be published online with each lesson. All the information for Friends From Afar will be stored in a binder in each room.



Pen Pal Letters

1st - 4th Graders have the unique opportunity to communicate with our Global Partner kids by sending pen pal letters! Each classroom has a “Pen Pal Bin” with cards, templates, stickers, and envelopes for children to draw pictures and write notes to kids in their grade who are serving with their families on the other side of the world. This past year, we had quite a few letters sent (emailed!) back and forth between kids! This is a special opportunity for our kids at LEFC to encourage one another and to connect with our Global Partner families.

Oikos Connection



Oikos is what we call the circle of people with whom we work, live and play, and with whom we share the hope of Jesus. Do you have your one person or one family you and your family are praying for to know the hope of the gospel message? We have several ministry events throughout the year that are great opportunities to prayerfully invite friends and family in your oikos. Here's a few of the events:

- **Family Christmas Event [first Friday in December]
- **Sundays when Created to Praise leads our worship services
- Christmas Eve services
- Every Sunday morning in Kids Ministry friends and family are welcome!

Sunday Morning Class Times

- **8:45 AM** - Doors to Kids Ministry area open
- **9:00 - 10:20 AM** - Our First Service class period
- **10:20 - 10:50 AM** - Transition time, for kids coming and going, including kids who are staying for both class times.
- **10:50 AM - 12:10 PM** - Our Second Service class period

If parents would like to pick up their kids earlier than 10:20 AM or 12:10 PM we ask that whenever possible, the parent would talk with their child's Shepherd before class so that they have a heads up that their child will be picked up early.

G4 Kids (4th Grade) Check-in & Dismissal

- Kids will check in at the kiosk and get their name tag prior to coming to class.
- Parents will be given an opportunity to indicate in writing for us if their 4th grader has permission to be dismissed without a parent or not.
- 4th grade kids will be able to leave on their own IF their parents have given permission at the beginning of the school year and/or when a child first begins attending.
- 4th grade kids will be dismissed at 10:35 on their own [IF we have parent Permission].
- 10:20AM or 12:10 PM is the official "end of class time" so parents who do not want their child to be dismissed on their own can plan to pick up their child at 10:20 AM or 12:10 PM.

How To Get Involved in Kids Ministry

As followers of Jesus, we are called to ministry!

In Scripture we see it explained like this: Every Christian is created for ministry [Ephesians 2:10], saved for ministry [2 Timothy 1:9], commanded to minister [Matthew 20:26-28], to be prepared for ministry [Ephesians 4:11-12], needed for ministry [1 Corinthians 12:27], accountable for ministry, and will be rewarded according to his or her ministry [Colossians 3:23-24].

In Rick Warren's *The Purpose Driven Church*, he puts it like this: "Every believer isn't a pastor, but every believer is called into ministry. God calls all believers to minister to the world and to the church. Service in the body isn't optional for Christians. In God's army, there are no volunteers—He's drafted all of us into service."

We are passionate about people using their gifts, experiences and love for the Lord in ministry with kids. Some people love teaching, while some people love connecting and talking with kids more than preparing and teaching. Some people love holding babies and caring for little ones in our nurseries while some people prefer to be with adults and welcome parents and families as part of our Welcome Team! Some people enjoy being behind the scenes and preparing supplies while others are energized by serving and/or leading on teams and events.

July and August Sundays

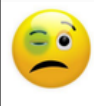


Each year we are blessed to have Shepherds who commit to teaching, investing in, and caring for children in all our classes from September through June. During July and August, we ask parents to partner with us on Sunday mornings to invest in the children while our year-round Shepherds have some time to recharge and refresh.

We structure our July and August Sundays to make it extra fun [and easy] for parents to be a part of our ministry with kids. This is a great way for parents to get to know the kids in their child's classes and to show support for all our Shepherds. Information about our July and August Sundays, including how to sign up and go through our clearance process typically begins in February each year. We share this info in our Friday Newsletter and in all other communication with families.

Evacuation Procedures



In the event of an Emergency, your children will be evacuated by the Kids Ministry Staff and Shepherds immediately. Parents will not be permitted to go into the Kids Ministry hallways for their own safety. After we have evacuated the building and have properly accounted for everyone, the Shepherds and helpers will assist you in collecting your children outside.



Children/Kids: we use the words children and kids interchangeably to describe our ministry with our youngest people in our church family, infants 2 months old through 4th graders!

KidMin: this is the abbreviation that is used when referencing LEFC's Kids Ministry

Shepherd: this is what we call the people who lovingly invest in children's lives in our classes.

Hands and Feet Buddy: a person who is part of our Hands and Feet ministry, who serves specifically with one child to provide support and encouragement to make Sundays great.

Junior Shepherd: this is what we call those who serve, helping Shepherds and investing in kids' lives, who are under 18 years of age.

Junior Shepherd Mentors: this is what we call the people who serve by leading our VIP for Junior Shepherds [which is a time for understanding the vision, getting info and training and praying together for the ministry].

Hallway Support: people who serve specifically to support our Shepherds as they serve.

Kids Ministry Welcome Desk: this is where you can register your child[ren] for attending Kids Ministry! Our welcome team will assist you in finding your child's class and knowing how to sign in [after you have registered] each week.

Kids Ministry Lounge area: this is the area you see when you walk into our Kids Ministry area that has couches and a fun kid-friendly world map on the wall!

Parent Resource Table: a table set up with resources for parents and families in the Kids Ministry Lounge.

Oikos: this is what we call the circle of people with whom we work, live and play, and with whom we share the hope of the gospel. We are not talking about yogurt here.

Global Partner: this is what we call our missionaries or those who serve vocationally, sharing the gospel in other cultures.

World Mobilization: this is what we call cross-culture missions or world outreach.

Kids and Worship

Kids in our Worship Services

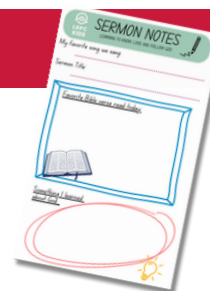


While we have Kids Ministry classes at both services, we want to clarify that your children are very welcome in our main services. If you attend an adult class and attend worship, you may opt to have your child attend the service with you rather than having them in a class. Children learn so much from being with us as parents, seeing us worship, listen, take communion, pray, and interact with the church family in our services. So prayerfully consider the best timing/season for involving your children and beginning the journey of teaching them how to be involved in our church's worship services.

"If children could be present for those marathon meetings with Jesus [both Matthew 14:15 and Mark 6:35 specify that the concern for food did not arise until after Jesus had been preaching all day], why shouldn't we include them for an hour or so of worship?" [Right from the Start, Morgenthaler, 185]

For those children who do come to the worship service, we have Kids Bulletins available for them to pick up as they walk into the service!



Family Worship Sundays

We have four Sundays each year that are specifically Family Worship Sundays:

- Memorial Day weekend
- 4th of July weekend
- Labor Day weekend
- the Sunday following Christmas

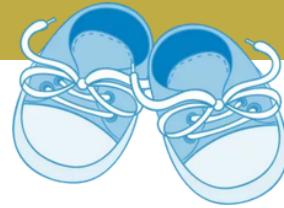


Family Worship Sundays are times when we intentionally invite families and children to worship together! This means that adult, youth, and children's classes are closed. We provide "Big Church Bags" to help children engage with and feel a part of our worship services.

Nurseries and 2-year-old classes are open on Family Worship Sundays.

Milestone Celebrations

Child Dedication



Several times a year, our church family sets aside time in our worship services for child dedications. As a church family, this is a time where we celebrate:

- Children being dedicated to the Lord, to love the Lord our God with all their heart, soul, strength and mind!
- Parents making a public commitment to invest in their children's lives by modeling a personal and growing relationship with Jesus and intentionally teaching their children to follow Jesus.
- Our church family making a public commitment to partner and support parents and families on this journey of discipling children!

Information about Child Dedications is communicated in the weekly bulletin and weekly church emails with details about signing up and attending a parent meeting with Pastor Tony prior to the dedication. Our church is so blessed by our pastor making this a very personal and special celebration.

Communion



We have put together a free, kid-friendly resource for talking about Communion with your child when they have questions! These workbooks have sections designed for parent-child interaction, sections designed to support and resource the parents in this discussion, and also some word games and puzzles for the kids.

Baptism



Our church family celebrates baptisms after the second service, typically on the second Sunday of the month. We encourage you to stay and include your children in hearing the testimonies of how God is working in people's lives!

When your child has interest in taking the step of being baptized, you can:

- Pick up the resource for kids that we have specifically on Baptism [at the Kids Ministry welcome desk]
- After reading and discussing this book with your child, if they are ready to take the next step you can call the church office to schedule a time to meet with one of the pastors about getting baptized.

More Ministries for Kids

Created to Praise

For children in grades 2-6, we have an annual children's worship workshop called Created to Praise. This includes 4 Sunday morning rehearsals in the weeks leading up to Palm Sunday, followed by leading worship in the main service on Palm Sunday.

WBF Kids Ministry

This ministry is designed especially for preschoolers [infants 2 months and older through Pre-K] whose moms are attending WBF on Thursday mornings. WBF Kids is a fun and intentionally planned, developmentally appropriate, hands-on environment for our young children to learn God's Word!



Re:Charge Kids



This is our ministry designed especially for kids whose parents are involved in either Re:generation or ReEngage. Re:Charge Kids is a highly relational environment that includes theme-based Bible learning activities and game time. This is a ministry for infants 2 months and older through 4th graders.
