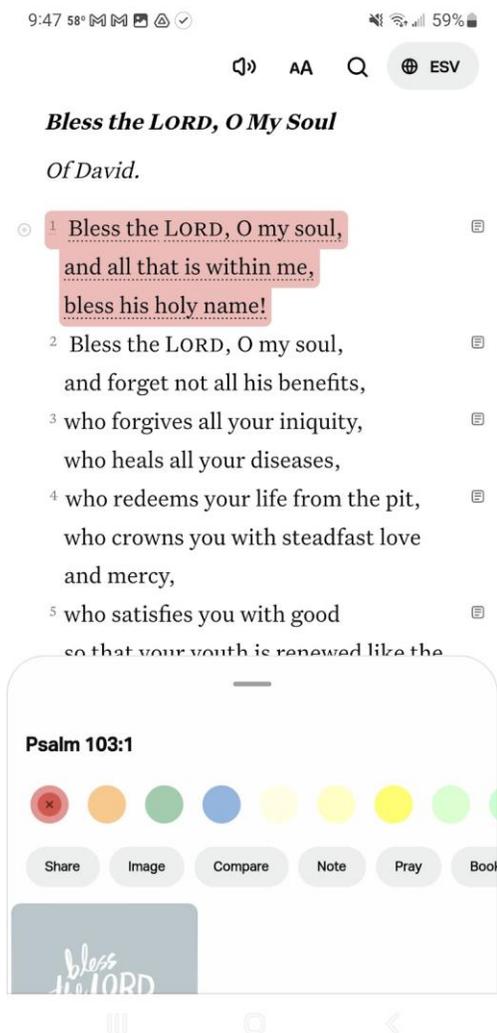
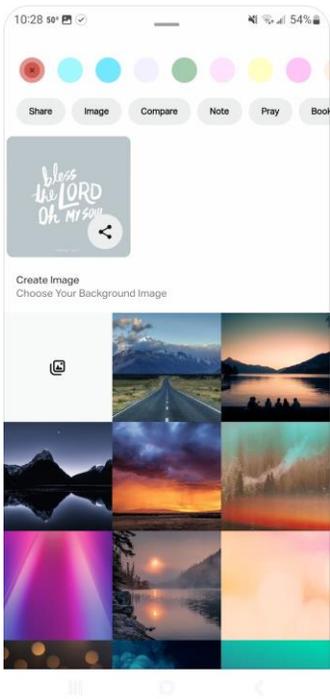


YouVersion Phone Wallpaper and Screen Lock Instructions: (Android)

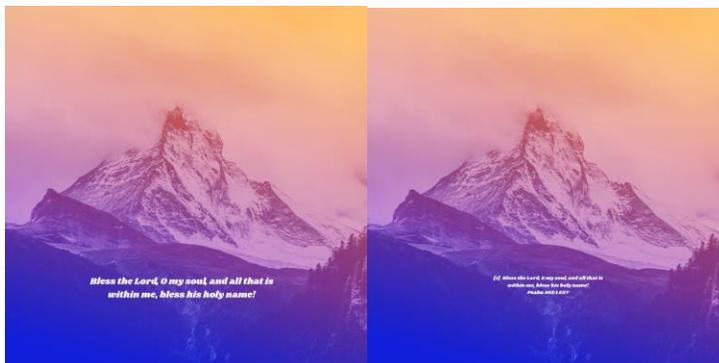
1. Download and Open YouVersion App
2. Search for desired verse, then click on desired verse or verses. When you do, the text will become faintly underlined.



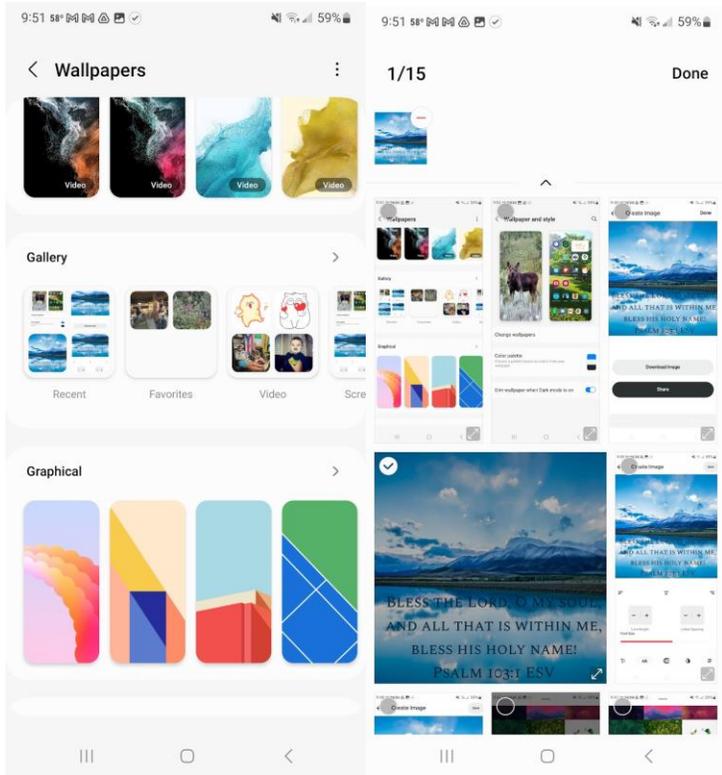
3. At the bottom of the screen, click on Image. A screen full of images appears. You can either click on the gallery to find your own image to add the verse to, or scroll through images to find one you like. Select the image and then click on "Select Image"



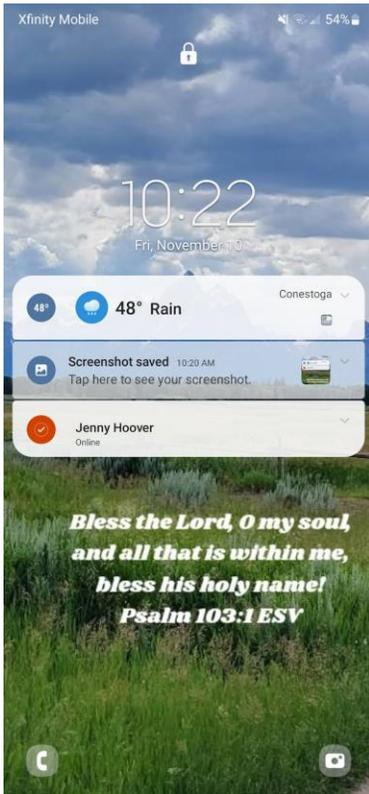
4. You'll see your verse appear. You can edit the verse, the font, the font size and color, etc. Make the font small and centered, because when you go to make it a lock or wallpaper screen, if you fill the entire image with text, you'll cut it off when you make it a screen.



5. Download the image.
6. Go into your phone settings and select "Wallpapers", find the image you created and select it.



7. Voila! A nice little screen with your weekly verse!

8. Download YouVersion App and login to account.
 9. Tap the passage you want to memorize.
 10. A pop-up will appear, scroll down and select a background image you like.
 11. Play around with the setting options on the bottom bar (font size, font color, picture dimensions, etc.)
 12. Once the picture is how you like it, select the "Save" button near the top right.
 13. Once the picture is done saving, select the "Share" bar under the picture. After sharing options appear, scroll down and select "save". The photo should now be saved in your phone in the Photos app.
 14. Go to the Photos app and find the most recent photo saved and once you have selected the photo, click on the share icon (small square with an arrow going down inside the square) and scroll down to the "Use as Wallpaper" option adjust sizing holding two fingers zooming in or out and then tap "Set".
- Tip: Make sure when you create the verse in the Youversion app that you leave large margins on the right and left of the text so that it doesn't get cut off when you make it your wallpaper.
