The Last Sermon of Jesus

John 12:36b-50

The last sermon of Jesus confronts us with the sobering reality that no one comes to Christ by natural sight alone or by beholding miracles; our eyes must be opened by God's grace. Jesus, the Light of the world, shines into the darkness to call sinners out of spiritual death and into life through faith. Yet the same gospel that saves all who believe in Him will stand in judgment over all who reject it. The question this passage presses upon every hearer is: What will we do with Jesus and His message?

1. You can only believe if your eyes are opened.

2. You can only live if Jesus's light shines through the darkness and draws you out of it.

3. You can only pass through the judgment of God by believing in His gospel, but if you don't believe, you will be judged by His gospel.
