Peter Will Stumble, Disciples Will Love, and Jesus Is Glorified

John 13:31-38

Jesus shares that this is the hour of His glorification—a glorification through betrayal, denial, and ultimately His death. Yet Jesus's death isn't merely a terrible byproduct of the plan of salvation; it is the manifestation of the Father's glory, the model for the way Jesus's disciples are to love one another, and the means by which fickle disciples like Peter are saved. Jesus calls us to live in light of this glory: trusting in His work on the cross and being transformed by His love to love others just as He has loved us.
