Testimony on Trial: The Witnesses to Jesus

John 5:30-47

Four witnesses testify to the veracity and authority of Jesus's ministry, but the Jewish people did not receive their testimony. Therefore, Jesus rebukes their unbelief and goes to the heart of their lack of faith--they love the praise of man more than the praise of God. Ultimately, what hangs in the balance is salvation and eternal life, and Jesus's message confronts us with a question: "Will you believe the testimony of these witnesses and the Savior they substantiate and have life in His name, or will you reject them to your demise?"

These three reasons have one thing in common: they see people as "bigger" (that is, more powerful and significant) than God, and, out of the fear that creates in us, we give other people the power and right to tell us what to feel, think, and do."
