A New Exodus, One Greater than Moses, A Power Displayed Through Weakness

John 6:1-15

John five left off with the Jews harkening back to the ministry of Moses for their identity. His words were what they were banking on. But the contrast between the end of John five and the beginning of John six couldn't be more palpable. Everything in John six points to the fact that Jesus is the prophet that Moses anticipated in Deuteronomy 18:15. Indeed, He is even greater than Moses. The demonstration of this reality is the surpassing greatness of Jesus's ministry compared to Moses's ministry.
