

Practical Encouragement for the Church Family, Part 3

I Timothy 5:3-16

Big Truth of this Series: God has commissioned the people of God, the church, to be grounded in sound doctrine and to live in a godly manner according to His truth.

Big Truth of Today's Message: Sound doctrine is always intensely practical, yielding godly living in how we relate to widows within the church.

God has a concern for the proper honoring of believing and godly widows. 5:3, 5-7

The families of widows have primary responsibility for their care. 5:4, 8, 16.

Qualifications for inclusion on the widow ministry list. 5:9-10

Instructions concerning younger widows. 5:11-15
