From Crisis to Confidence: A Story of Faith

John 4:43-54

The official in John 4 is much like many of us; he first seeks Jesus not on account of who He is but on account of what He can do for him. However, as the interaction with Jesus unfolds, his faith matures all the way to the point where the official leads his family in crying out to Jesus not merely as a healer but as the Savior. John mentions this second sign to substantiate the sufficiency of the Savior and to call us all to believe in Him.

1. Desperation (vv. 46-49)

2. Decision (v. 50)

3. Discovery (vv. 52-53)

4. Devotion (v. 53)
