The Witness of Words and Works

John 10:31-42; Psalm 82

Questions to Consider

How does Jesus describe His works in verses 32, 37, and 38, and why is that description important to His argument?

Why does Jesus appeal to Psalm 82 in response to the charge of blasphemy? What point is He making from the Scriptures?

What was Jesus's view of Scripture? How should that shape our views about Scripture?

We don't know everything that John the Baptist said about Jesus but we do know many things he said about Him (see John 1:29-34). By the end of John 10, how have those things been demonstrated to be true? What things remain to be seen?

Why do these religious leaders continue to reject Jesus despite the testimony of both His words and His works? What does this passage teach us about the nature of unbelief?

Jesus issues a final public witness in Jerusalem before withdrawing from the city. John's Gospel is now moving steadily toward the cross. Yet Jesus's departure is by no means amicable. The Jews seek to kill Him, insisting that it is not His works that offend them but His words—His claim to divine sonship. Jesus, however, refuses to separate the two. The works He performs from the Father testify to the truth of what He says about Himself. Their rejection exposes the depth of their unbelief and sets the stage for His withdrawal beyond the Jordan, where He receives a very different response: many believe in Him.
