What Kind of Love is That?

John 11:1-44

Jesus is both the compassionate Savior who enters into the grief of His people and the sovereign Son of God who has absolute authority over life and death. Jesus delays upon hearing of Lazarus's illness in order to demonstrate what is most needed: not only a Savior who can heal us, but a Savior who can even conquer death. This displays His glory. When Jesus calls Lazarus to rise, He gives us a window into His identity: He is the resurrection and the life. He resurrects us spiritually now, and one day He will resurrect us physically as well. This story of Lazarus's resurrection calls us to trust Christ when we are confused and suffering, resting in the certainty that He is the resurrection and the life and that all who believe in Him will never perish, even though they die.
