

Passing the Baton - Part 2 The Major Task

II Timothy 4:1-2

Big Truth of this Series: The apostle Paul encourages and warns Timothy and all believers to follow, entrust, and be always ready to proclaim God's Word with confidence and joy as days of difficulty lie ahead.

Big Truth of Today's Message: Paul's charge to Timothy (and to us) is to prioritize the proclamation of God's Word. He gives us the who, the why, the what, the when, and the how of proclaiming God's Word.

- v. 1- "I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His kingdom, preach..."
 - Paul lays out the "who" and the "why" of the task of proclaiming God's Word.

- v. 2a "Preach the Word!"
 - The major task of proclamation has a specific "what" or content.

- v. 2b "Be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort with complete patience and teaching."
 - "When" and "how" we are to proclaim God's Word.
