From Condemnation to Consecration

John 7:53-8:11

The scribes and Pharisees bring to Jesus a woman caught in the act of adultery. They present her to Jesus, hoping that her case will provide a reason to accuse him. Jesus silences her self-righteous accusers and then deals with the shame of the woman by delivering the verdict: no condemnation! Freed from condemnation, she is called to live a life of consecration and devotion. That's not only her story; it is, in essence, the story of every Christian.
