The Good Shepherd

John 10:1-18

Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd. His character is completely unlike any other in this world on account of three things: who He is, what He does, and what He is like to us. When we truly understand what He offers us in Himself, we cannot help but love, worship, and obey Him.
