First Followers of Jesus

John 1:35-51

Jesus did not launch His kingdom through a mass event or campaign, but through people introducing other individuals to meet and follow the Savior. Because of who Jesus is, friends bring friends to Him.

vs. 37-40 – Jesus' first two followers were Andrew and an unnamed disciple.

vs. 41-42 – Andrew brought his brother, Simon, to meet Jesus.

vs. 43-44 – Philip was the fourth disciple to follow Jesus.

vs. 45-51 – Nathaniel was the fifth disciple to meet Jesus.
