Seeing the Father

John 14:8-14

Philip asks Jesus for a favor, "Show us the Father." His request reveals they were looking for something more, even though Christ had already made the Father known. Jesus responds, "Haven't you seen Me?" because to have seen the Son is to have seen the Father. Jesus perfectly reveals who God is. This raises the inevitable questions of authority and certainty: by what authority does Jesus make this claim, and how can we be sure that it's true? Jesus promises that his followers will continue his work and invites them to ask in his name—not for their own glory, but “that the Father may be glorified in the Son.”

Questions to Consider

Why did the disciples struggle so deeply to understand what Jesus said concerning Himself? How are we tempted to be like them?

What were Jesus's works supposed to do according to this passage?

In what sense are Jesus's followers supposed to do greater works than He has done?

How should a right interpretation of v. 14 mold and shape us as Christ's followers?

2. Haven't you seen?
3. By what authority?
4. How can we know?
5. What will you ask?
