## A THRILL OF HOPE PASTOR KYLE BACKHAUS

We all have our favorite Christmas carols. Perhaps your favorite is Mariah Carey's "All I Want for Christmas," which last I heard earns her more than 1 million dollars each Christmas. Or, perhaps you treasure "Silent Night," which has been performed by countless artists over the last two hundred years. "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing," "O Come All Ye Faithful," "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," "O Little Town of Bethlehem": all of these Christmas carols are beautiful and can remind

us what we celebrate at Christmas.

In 1847, in a small village in southern France, a church had just refurbished their pipe organ. The priest wanted to celebrate and asked the town poet to write some special poetry for Christmas Eve when the new organ was to be revealed. The priest took the poet's words and went and found a composer to put the poem into music. Finally, on Christmas Eve, he hired an opera singer to share not only

the restored pipe organ but the hymn "O Holy Night."

The song never really caught on, until a number of years later, a man by the name of John Sullivan Dwight got a hold of the song and had it translated into English. He published it in his own journal of music. The song was first sung in English in 1855 and remains a prominent Christmas hymn to this very day: "O holy night, the stars are brightly shining; it is the night of the dear Savior's birth. Long lay the world in sin and error pining, till He appeared and the

soul felt its worth. A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices, for yonder breaks a new and glorious morn! Fall on your knees! O hear the angel voices! O night divine! O night when Christ was born! O night divine! O night, O night divine!"

"O Holy Night" is another beautiful Christmas carol that helps us reflect on the birth of Jesus and on the story of humanity's redemption. This Advent season, we will begin a sermon series called "A Thrill of Hope," where we will use the text "O Holy Night" to help us understand and prepare our hearts for the birth of Jesus. Each week, we will use one of the verses of this beloved hymn as a launch point to teach about who Jesus is and what He has come to accomplish by coming into this world. We hope you will join us as we examine this beloved carol and prepare our hearts to celebrate God's great gift of love - the birth of our Savior - throughout the season of Advent.

### THE RED LETTER CHALLENGE

Members of St. Paul Lutheran Church,

Time flies. Five years ago, the staff planned to lead the congregation in a book study for Lent. We made it two weeks into the book and the activities we had planned, and then we were forced to close our doors due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

It is now November 2025. Before we know it, the Christmas celebration will be over and Ash Wednesday on February 18, 2026, will move us into the season of Lent, which precedes Easter.

We have normally done a special Lenten Midweek sermon series, and while we have yet to determine what that will be this year, I am excited that we are going to be bringing back the Red Letter Challenge for regularly scheduled services. Lent is a great time to reflect on our lives as God's people, and this book and study should help us do just that.

This year, during regular Thursday and Sunday services, we will be preaching on topics from Red Letter Challenge. In some Bibles, the words of Jesus are written in red to help us focus on the words and instructions of Jesus. That is exactly what the Red Letter Challenge does. Jesus says in Matthew 7, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on rock." When life batters us around and we encounter difficulties and trials, we need a strong foundation: the words of Jesus.

If you still have your book from 5 years ago, now is the time to find it and dust it off. If you don't have a book, we want to encourage you to pick up a copy of the book, Red Letter Challenge by Zach Zehnder, and join us as we embark on the journey of following the instructions Jesus gave us. Each week will cover one of five categories: Being, Forgiving, Serving, Giving, and Going. Each day contains a devotion and then a practical guide to put the words of Jesus into action in our lives. These challenges are meant to push us out of our comfort



zones, help us grow as individuals and as a church, as we live out the word of God together. The church staff has already gone through the book and are excited about what this could mean for our church!

If you are ready to join in the Challenge, great! Bring your book and we will begin our sermon series on February 15, where we will help explain how the series will work. If you don't have a book, there will be envelopes at the Ministry House in the Gathering Area where you can order a book. Each book is \$10. For families, we are excited that there is a kid's version of the Red Letter Challenge. This version would be great for families with kids 3 years old through 6th grade. The kid's book is a workbook that has many different activities and a wide range of challenges to fit many levels of maturity and understanding. Consider picking up one for each child. These are also \$10.

The weekend of December 14, we will share a promotional video. Book orders are due by January 11 so that we can make sure that we have the right amount of materials. If you order a book, you can pick it up at church on January 29. A bracelet and a helpful bookmark will be available to everyone to encourage and remind us of this challenge. We invite you to pick those items up and participate in an activity we have planned at church each week.

Small groups will be offered to help guide you through this Challenge. While we hope that this will benefit you as you go through the Red Letter Challenge, we also hope that you will make life-long friendships, enjoy studying the Word of God together, and continue to do so into the future. Small group sign up will begin mid-January in the Gathering Area.

February 12-15 will be our kickoff weekend as we introduce the book and get you ready to join us on a 40-day challenge to live out the words of Jesus. We encourage everyone to participate, as we believe this book can not only make a difference in your life, but in the life of our church and our community.

If you have any questions or would like to see a copy of the book in advance, you can check it out at the Ministry House starting December 1.

### **Youth Ministry Update**







### Twenty Families in an Aisle: When God Opens a Mission Field in Walmart

Not long ago, I experienced something that reminded me why the Lord calls us to go out, to walk, to seek, and to speak the Gospel everywhere. One day I went to the Walmart in Sheboygan with a handful of business cards, some church flyers... and a heart willing to listen and to serve.

I didn't have a perfect plan. There wasn't an organized event. I only had the conviction that Jesus sends His servants to where the people are.

For three hours I walked through those aisles: through toys, vegetables, the bakery, electronics, cleaning supplies... ordinary places where almost no one would expect the Holy Spirit to be at work. But God has no limits.

That day, I met twenty new families. Twenty faces, twenty stories, twenty voices full of hope and pain. And to my surprise... they were all Venezuelan families.

Some had just arrived; others didn't know anyone; most were searching for stability, community, a place where their children are safe, and a warm embrace in the middle of so much change. But deeper than all of that... they carry a longing that only Christ can fill, even if they don't yet know how to express it.

Between aisles, shopping carts, and timid smiles, I was able to hand out cards, share information about our church, and above all... share the Gospel. Right there, in Walmart, in the heart of Sheboygan.

Because the Gospel is not tied to a building or limited to a schedule. The Gospel walks, seeks, listens, embraces, and is proclaimed in every place and to every tongue.

That day, I understood something very deep: our ministry isn't passive—we don't wait for the Hispanic community to come to us. The community is already here, and that's exactly why we go to them wherever God leads us... even to Walmart. Into the places where they live, shop, work, and learn. They need to hear Christ crucified and risen. They need a church that loves them, welcomes them, and walks beside them.

But this work cannot be done alone. Behind every conversation, every card handed out, and every family reached, God is at work—and so are the people who pray, support, donate, and believe that He is doing something great among the Hispanics of Sheboygan County.

That's why I invite you to join this mission. To be part of what God is doing. To support a ministry that goes out, that moves, that knocks on doors... and shares the love of Jesus where you least expect it.

Because if God can open a mission field in the aisles of Walmart, imagine what He can do with your support, your prayers, and your generosity.
