Dear parents,

We hope you had a good Thanksgiving and had some enjoyable family time over the holiday. Now we move into the last month of 2025. Our last school days will be Dec. 21 and 22. Child Care is open December 23, 26, 29 and Jan. 2 if we have 5 or more children needing care. It is closed December 24, 25, 31 & January 1. If your child will not need care, please remember to tell us so you can use

some of your vacation days with no charge.

The next few weeks of December are called Advent in the church year. This is a time of "getting ready" (not only our houses and lives, but especially our hearts) for Jesus' birthday on Christmas.

At school, we use Advent colors—blue (for waiting and hope) and pink (for joy). The Advent wreath is a circle (God's love is never-ending).



Every Sunday in Advent, another candle is lit so that as Christmas gets closer, the wreath gets brighter. The Advent chain, in the same colors, gets shorter as Christmas gets closer. The children place a new figure each day on the Advent calendar, working up to Christmas when the picture will be complete.

- You are given up to 1 day per month of attendance that you can use any way you choose as vacation from Child Care.
- Give us the date(s) by the Friday of the week before to use this benefit.
- You will receive notification of how many days you have used at the end of December and May.

Extra Clothes

If your child has a set of clothes stored at the center, you may want to take a minute to check the type of extra clothing your child has at school in case of accidents. Now that the weather is cooler, you will want to substitute long sleeved shirts or pants if you had originally sent

short sleeves or shorts. The bags of clothes are kept in one of the bathroom cabinets. If you want to see what you have here, just ask a teacher to help you find your child's clothes.

Children in Church

We hear many of the children indicate they do not go to church or Sunday School. If you have avoided this because of the age of your child, here are some helpful suggestions when you are ready to try.

Here at school, your child is learning to sit and listen to stories about Jesus and is becoming familiar with what goes on in church as we go to Chapel. Try some of these ideas when you bring your child to church.

- ♦ Talk about church the night before.
- ♦ Sit near the front, if possible
- ♦ Use the children's bulletin, if available
- ♦ Point our pictures and symbols to children and explain them

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Christmas Service



Just as you are preparing for Christmas, so are we. The children have been practicing finger plays and songs for the Christmas service. This will be held in church on Tuesday, Dec. 2 at 6:30 pm. Extended family is invited.

Use the east entrance into the church. **Doors will unlock at 6:15 pm.** Bring your child to Room 100 which is on the far side of the large area you come into (behind the house). No special clothing is needed, just nice school or church clothes.

This is a worship service, so we ask that there be no clapping or flash photography during the service. Video is fine. Thank you!

Following the service, come to Room 100 to pick up your child and as you leave the building, there will be refreshments available.

We are asking those in the 3AM and 4K classes to bring 8-10 cookies, those in 3PM Preschool to bring a bottle of light colored juice or soda. Please bring these during the day of Dec. 1 or 2 so we have time to prepare the refreshment tables before the evening service.

As you busily prepare for Christmas, may your heart be calmed and filled with joy as you think of that tiny baby in the manger and what He did for you.
