



RETURNING TOGETHER: CONNECTING TO CHRIST IN LENT

Dear Brothers and Sisters
in Christ,

"Therefore say to them, Thus declares the LORD of hosts: Return to me, says the LORD of hosts, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts."
-Zechariah 1:3

As February arrives, we begin to look to the season of Lent. Lent is not meant to feel heavy or distant. It is a gracious invitation from our Lord to slow down, reflect, and draw near to Him again. At St. Paul, we do not walk this season alone. We walk it

together, gathered around God's Word and anchored in the promises He has kept for us in Jesus!

Lent begins with honesty and hope. On Ash Wednesday we are reminded that we are dust, and that sin touches every part of our lives. Yet even in that reminder, God speaks a word of comfort. He calls us to return to Him and promises that He comes to meet us with mercy. Throughout these weeks, our worship will continually point us to Jesus, who willingly went to the cross

and finished the work of our salvation for us.

One way we will journey together this Lent is through the Red Letter Challenge, which will shape both our Thursday evening and Sunday morning worship. The Red Letter Challenge was created to help Christians focus intentionally on following Jesus by paying close attention to His own words (often printed in red in many Bibles). It reminds us that faith is not just about having good intentions but about keeping our eyes fixed on Christ. Because God has been so gracious to us, we are drawn to

follow Jesus more closely. As we hear His words together, we will be encouraged to live lives marked by grace, compassion, and love for others.

Alongside the Red Letter Challenge, our midweek Lenten services will also include the theme *It Is Finished*, based on the prophecies of Zechariah. These sermons will guide us through the events of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection, showing how God's promises were fulfilled in Christ. From the call to "Return to Me" on Ash Wednesday, through themes such as "Scattered Sheep," "The Kingly Priest," and "Look at the One Who Was Pierced," we will see again that nothing about Jesus' journey to the cross was uncertain. At the cross, Jesus declared, "It is finished." Our sins are forgiven! Our salvation is secure!

Our hope and prayer is that this Lenten season will be a time of renewed worship, fellowship, and growth for all of us. Come and be a part of it! Gather with God's people! Invite a friend or neighbor to join you. Through Word and Sacrament, the Lord is at work among us, strengthening our faith and drawing us closer together. As we return to the Lord this Lent, may we trust His promise that He always returns to us with grace, forgiveness, and life in Jesus. As He draws us back to Himself, may He also use us to live out our calling as a congregation, "Connecting People to Christ." Through our worship, our words, and our care for one another, may this season be a time when we are strengthened in faith and sent out in love, so that others may come to know the Savior who finished the work for them as well!

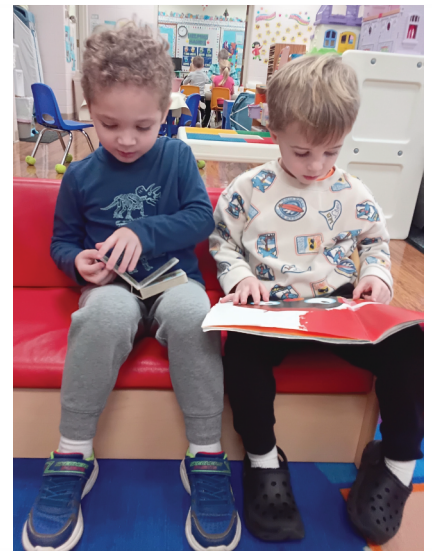

Enrollment for the 2026-2027 school year has begun. The following classes are available – 3 year old Preschool which meets on T, Th from 9:00-11:30 AM or 12:30-3:00 PM and the 4K program which meets M, W, and F from 8:30-11:30 AM.



A spot will be saved for your child when the registration form (yellow tri-fold found on the wall in the Gathering Area) along with the \$75 registration fee is turned in. Bring it to the Early Childhood Center or the Church Office. Tuition is \$100 per month for Preschool and \$170 per month for 4K. The SCRIP program is available to help offset the costs, and earnings can be banked as soon as a child is enrolled.

Child Care is also available on days or times when your child is not in school. Openings are available for children ages 2 ½ - 5 years old. Child Care is open Monday – Friday from 7:00 AM – 5:30 PM. The hourly rate is \$5.75 per hour for 3-5 yr. olds and \$6.00 for 2 ½-3 yr. olds. 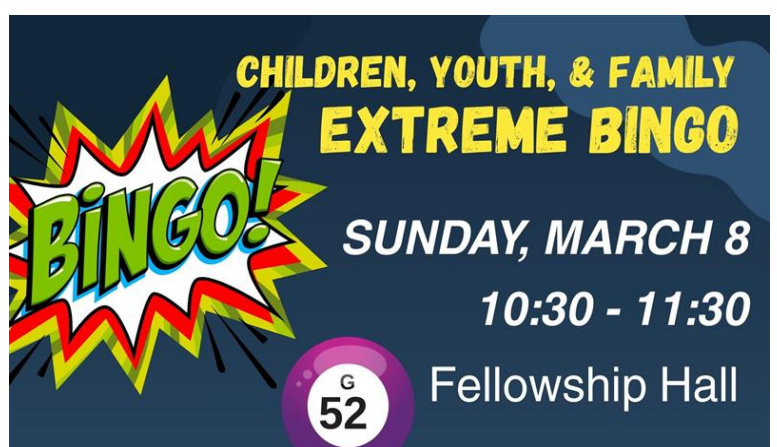

We all have a story. Within those stories, there are chapters that are filled with wonderful tales and adventures. These chapters are fun to tell and easy to spin. Other chapters are filled with hardship and shame. These chapters are hard to tell, and are often told with downcast eyes and tears. They are hard to walk through. It may be a time of loneliness and brokenness. Sometimes, we get stuck in our hardship and shame, and don't know how to move through the valley of the shadow. We need help.

Love INC's Connection Center is the place where such chapters unfold. Our Intake Specialists listen and calmly breathe hope and life into our neighbors' stories, so that the chapter can be turned and a new ending can be written. As each neighbor shares with an intake specialist, hope is ignited. A relationship has begun that will transform a life.

One of our neighbors has a story that is a perfect example of a chapter turned and the hope of a new ending. This gentleman called us, brand new to Sheboygan. He is a veteran and disabled. Pain would rack his body every day. He needed furniture. We listened to his story and met his need of furniture. The Furniture Ministry Team sat with him, listened, prayed, and gave him a Bible. The next week, he called us letting us know that he would be going to rehab for his pain medication addiction. The love and compassion of the volunteers he interacted with encouraged him to begin to change his story.

Our Neighbor Liaisons continued to call and check on this man weekly. He was depressed and lonely. He was off the narcotic pain killers, but still was in pain. Volunteers also sent him encouragement cards. We continued to love on him. He struggled with God. We prayed with him.

One day, we heard a plot twist. Our neighbor began to read the Bible again. He watched church online. He prayed. The Holy Spirit was on the move. He began to see the goodness of God in his life. The last time we talked with him, we found out that he is engaged to a lovely woman who wants to join her story with his. He feels he has a purpose, not only to follow God, but to become a good husband and serve others. He said that his life has new meaning and is grateful to Love INC for supporting him while he turned the chapter and wrote a new ending to his story.

The heart and soul of Love INC are relationships with our neighbors. What a joy to see and hear the wonderful things God does as we love our neighbors!

Preparing Christian Leaders - One Student at a Time has been the mission of Sheboygan Lutheran High for many years. Christian leadership is exemplified in so many ways, just one of which is by loving and serving our neighbors, and we've been doing quite a bit of that recently. Take a peek at the various ways our Crusaders have been impacting their community:

- Our Love & Serve Winterim class volunteered at the Salvation Army, spent time playing BINGO with residents at Pine Haven Christian Communities, packaged meals for the Sheboygan County Food Bank, and delivered lunches for Fresh Meals on Wheels.
- Crusader basketball teams tutor and mentor students weekly at Longfellow Elementary School and assist with Special Olympics.
- Cross country runners participate in community runs, like the Holiday Lights Run to benefit the Sheboygan County Food Bank.
- National Honor Society provided Christmas cheer to residents at Meadow View Manor Nursing Home, led a Christmas drive to assist LHS families in need, and will host their annual trivia night to support the Wounded Warrior Project.
