

FEBRUARY CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY UPDATE: Children, Youth & Family Events are going very well this school year. Confirmation has 55 students with retreat season almost upon us. They have also done several service projects. There are an average of 15-25 youth attending youth group. They do monthly service projects and family events.

There are 2 mission trips this summer Nicole is planning, 15 are serving in Northern Wisconsin and 33 will be attending the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans. A big thank you was extended to Council for developing the matching funds program for fundraisers; that has been incredibly helpful.

Nicole serves as the District Coordinator and as the Parish Pros Coordinator for the District, which gives her great opportunity to connect with other professionals in similar roles throughout South Wisconsin. She also taught a youth ministry class at Concordia one evening recently.

POLICY #37 – Wee Care Nursery: This policy was updated to account for current practices in our nursery.

WORSHIP CENTER CONDENSER: Chad Berke reported that the Worship Center Condenser should be replaced. It is original to the building and parts are becoming difficult to get as the coolant is no longer being used. Costs for this equipment is going up considerably. He is recommending we look at replacing this. Three quotes will be presented at the March Council meeting. This will then be placed on the April Congregation Meeting agenda.

ELDER TEAM: The Elder Team had an informal gathering with both Pastors recently to build relationships.

SENIOR PASTOR REPORT: Pr Adam will be responsible for most of the same areas Pr Rob was responsible for, including Small Groups, Celebrate Recovery, Night to Shine and The Gathering Place. So far he is doing very well, working to build relationships with staff. In March he will be having a Meet the Minister Month, working on meeting individually with church leaders and congregation members to build more relationships. All Council members are encouraged to meet with him.

There are 24 people in the new AIM Class, the last day is March 30, Council members are encouraged to stop in and say hi. The Zeuner Bible Study is going well, with 50-70 people attending. St. Paul Serves is in the planning stages. Projects have been selected and we are working on finding leaders. Pr Kyle is now the Circuit Visitor for Sheboygan West, which is a 3-year commitment. He is responsible for the monthly meeting, conflict resolution in congregations and filling vacancies.
