"For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
(Mark 10:45)

May is a season when the world around us seems to come alive again. Trees bud, flowers bloom, and signs of new life are everywhere. 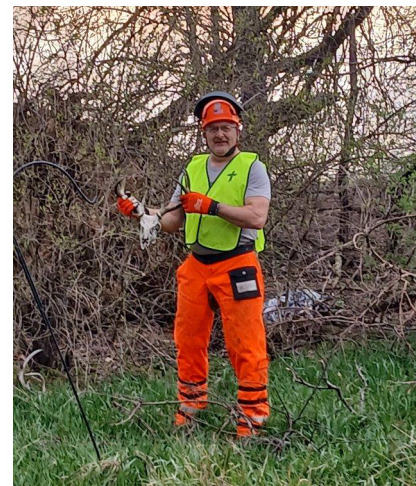
LUTHERAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

St. Paul LERT Team Serves Storm-Damaged Community in Michigan

Four members of St. Paul Lutheran Church recently traveled to Edwardsburg, Michigan as part of a Lutheran Emergency Response Team (LERT) to assist families recovering from devastating EF3 tornadoes that struck the community on March 10. Jim Fasse, Mark and Jody LaPean, and Pete Strains joined seven other volunteers from the South Wisconsin and Northern Illinois Districts for a week of chainsaw work and debris removal.

The tornadoes tragically claimed the life of a 12-year-old boy and left many families displaced, with homes and properties suffering extensive damage. St. Paul Lutheran Church in Cassopolis, Michigan graciously hosted the LERT volunteers as they served at six homes during their deployment.

One of the team's most impactful visits was to the home of an elderly widow whose property was covered with fallen trees. Her son, overwhelmed by the destruction, asked, "Where do I even begin?" The LERT volunteers stepped in with compassion and determination, working diligently to restore order and safety.



At the end of the day, they presented the widow with a slice of one of her trees, carved with a cross and signed by the team. Overjoyed, she shared, "I can't believe what you accomplished in just one day! Many thanks to all of you!"

The team also worked at neighboring properties, clearing dangerous hanging limbs and fallen trees from homes and fence lines. At one site, homeowners and their four dogs had sheltered inside during the storm, escaping injury but understandably shaken. Both homeowners expressed deep gratitude for the volunteers' efforts and care. One even treated the team to pastries from a local bakery as a gesture of appreciation.

At another property, the volunteers assisted a gentleman who goes by "Mr. B" by removing two downed trees near his pond and clearing two trees leaning dangerously over railroad tracks behind his home. He later shared this message on social media: "I received some much appreciated help from some volunteers from the Lutheran Church today. They cut up and cleared some trees and brush on my property from the tornado. They came from Wisconsin and truly cared for me while here. They even presented me with a plaque they made from my cut wood. God bless them all!"



Through their hands-on service and heartfelt compassion, our St. Paul volunteers made a lasting impact—helping not only to clear debris, but to restore hope in a community recovering from tragedy. We give thanks for their willingness to serve and for "Connecting People to Christ by bringing His love to those in need."

APRIL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

April 21, 2026 Council Meeting Minutes

Worship Ministry Update: Thomas Walkenhorst gave an update on worship. We'll be moving to the Summer Schedule on May 17, with two services on Sundays. Music ensembles worked hard through Holy Week. Adult Choir and Bell Choir will be wrapping up their season shortly. Thomas continues to look for instrumentalists.

Thomas leads various things weekdays, including ECC Chapel and activities, along with TGP sing-alongs. He plans hymns and praise songs and assists with media and slides as needed. He is looking at potentially testing out having no paper bulletins in the summer. This is still under discussion. He created a Praise Team Handbook this year and continues to make adjustments. He'd love to raise up lay leaders to help fill his role at times to allow him time off on occasion.

Senior Pastor Update: Holy Week and Easter went well. The 9:30 AM Easter Service had 608 people. There were some traffic issues. Staff have discussed ideas for improvements next year. Some feel continuous Communion should be held at the 8:00 AM service. At this point Pr. Kyle is not going to make that change, as many members in that service want the ability to go to the Communion rail.

Budgeting has started. St. Paul Serves is well underway with 214 people registered so far. The Pastors are hoping to get some time away this summer to spend with their families.

TGP Furniture: The blue furniture at Entrance 3 will be replaced with TGP funds, as they use it the most frequently. This furniture was donated to us 15 years ago, so it is well worn and ready for replacement.

Capital Projects: The Council reviewed the Capital Project plan. This is in the process of being updated through the budgeting process.

Security – Bollards/Camera System: It has been suggested to place cement bollards at a couple entrances to prevent vehicles from potentially crashing into the building. Our camera system is also outdated. Stefanie will contact the police department for a security walk-through of the building. With their recommendations, she will put together a plan to present to the Church Council in the future.

Walk-In Item – Blacktop: There was concern of a pipe raising in the parking lot. This is not a pipe, rather a culvert that was placed for drainage. We are in the process of obtaining quotes for crack filling.

Walk-In Item – Lutheran Education Scholarships: In preparation of the budget, Stefanie Trakel asked if the Council would like to increase the scholarship designations, as tuition continues to rise. Scholarships are funded by Home Missions and the Church Operation Budget. Stefanie will put together a proposal for the May Council Meeting. It was suggested to have an annual percentage increase through the budgeting process.

Walk-In Item – Guest WIFI Network: For security purposes, our Guest WIFI should be password protected. This helps to prevent automated attacks. Pros4Tech will set this up. The password will be posted throughout the building.

APRIL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED

Walk-In Item – New Ministry Ideas: The Council had challenged staff to begin thinking big picture for ministry expansion, given our recent generous donations.

Pr. Kyle outlined a new ministry that would provide meals during time of need, such as illness, new baby, financial distress, isolation, or new to the community. Volunteers would gather to make freezer meals in our kitchen. Those meals would be in a freezer that members could then sign out as they encounter people that could benefit. The meals would also include our church information, a prayer card, and our service information. It is a form of discipleship through a non-obtrusive way, through a simple meal. It also creates fellowship and community among members that make the meals. We could potentially add a garden to the yard as well to help supply ingredients. The Council was very interested in the meal ministry. They asked Pr. Kyle to put together a more detailed proposal of actual expenses. There is also an opportunity for grants from the District to cover start-up costs, such as a freezer.

Pr. Kyle also shared the potential of planting a church on the southside of the county, near Oostburg/Cedar Grove area. There is an LCMS church gap in this area. If we were to do this, another Pastor would need to be hired to take on the initiative. The District would also need to be involved. The Church Planting discussion should continue with the District Office.

April 21, 2026 Congregation Meeting Minutes

March 2026 Treasurer's Report: Donna Felch presented the financial reports. Nine months into the year, current giving has a shortfall of about \$38,000 in comparison to budget. However, with expenses under budget, there is a modest surplus of about \$402. Giving to the general fund has dramatically increased in response to the need, which we are very thankful for. In addition to operations, the church has been blessed with two undesignated special gifts totaling about \$474,000. Such gifts are rare, occurring infrequently. Our current policy is that those gifts go to our operating budget. At the end of this fiscal year, the Council will look at the biggest needs and allocate these funds. Members are welcome to suggest thoughts on how to utilize. Updated information about dedicated accounts, Endowment Fund, and memorial gifts were also presented. The Endowment Fund's milestone of more than \$1 million in donations and earnings were noted.

LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

Each year, Sheboygan Lutheran High School sets aside a full day dedicated entirely to serving others—a tradition known as Service Day. This annual event sends students and staff across Sheboygan County to share Christ's love through hands-on acts of service. More than just a break from the classroom, Service Day is a living expression of the school's mission of Preparing Christian Leaders—One Student at a Time.

Service Day mobilizes the entire student body into teams that partner with local churches, nonprofits, and community organizations. This year, students served at a wide range of locations, each offering unique opportunities to help meet real needs in the community. These sites included Bookworm Gardens, Pine Haven, Neat Repeats Thrift Shop, Kohler-Andrae State Park, Christopher Farm and Gardens, Lutheran Cemetery, John Michael Kohler Arts Center, and several Lutheran churches and schools.

At each location, students engaged in meaningful work—cleaning, organizing, landscaping, assisting staff, preparing spaces for public use, and supporting ministries that serve families, seniors, and neighbors in need. Whether pulling weeds at a park, sorting donations at a thrift shop, or helping maintain church grounds, students experienced firsthand how small acts of service can make a significant difference.

Most importantly, Service Day is about far more than completing tasks. At its core, it is a lesson in Christian leadership. Sheboygan Lutheran emphasizes that serving others is not about feeling good, earning recognition, or achieving a sense of self-righteousness. Instead, students are taught that service is an opportunity to serve God by serving their neighbor. Their good works are not meant to point back to themselves, but to point others to Jesus.

Many students return from their service sites with stories of gratitude—both from those they served and from their own realization of how meaningful it is to give their time and energy for the sake of others...and they have a lot of fun in the process!

Service Day stands as a powerful reminder that faith is active. It moves beyond the walls of the school and into the community, shining Christ's light in practical, tangible ways. By participating in this annual tradition, Sheboygan Lutheran students learn that serving others is not just something Christians do—it is part of who they are, and part of the calling God places on their lives. At the end of the day, service is really about one thing... serving God in ways that direct hearts, minds, and eyes toward Jesus.
