GIVING HIM THANKS! PASTOR ADAM WOLFE

Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan.

—Luke 17:15-16

Dear Friends of God through Jesus,

As we enter the month of November, our hearts naturally turn toward thanksgiving—a time to pause and remember all that God has given and to respond in gratitude. The story of the ten lepers in Luke 17 reminds us of what true thankfulness looks like. Ten were healed, but only one turned back to give thanks to Jesus. All had received the same gift, but only one recognized the Giver standing before him.

This true story in God's Word still speaks to us today. How often do we, too, receive God's blessings—our health, our homes, our families, our church community—and yet

move on with busy hearts, forgetting to return to Jesus with thanks? True thanksgiving begins not just with words around a dinner table, but with hearts that pause to recognize God's hand as the giver of all good gifts.

This Thanksgiving, may we be like that one who returned to give thanks. In worship, in prayer, and in our daily lives, let's stop and give thanks to Jesus—the Giver of every good and perfect gift!

Throughout the month of November here at St. Paul, our sermon series The Endless Pursuit of More will invite us to look deeply at the desires that so often pull our hearts away from God. We'll consider how our pursuit of comfort, perfection, and possessions can become endless when our eyes are fixed on the things of this world. Yet in Jesus, we find true lasting satisfaction and rest that nothing else in this world can provide.

We'll begin by reflecting on our desire for Comfort—how easily we turn to things or distractions to make life easier, and how God calls us instead to find true comfort in Him.

Then we'll look at Perfectionism—our struggle with high expectations and the peace that comes from knowing Christ's perfect grace covers our imperfections.

Finally, we'll turn to Money and Stuff—our tendency to chase after "just a little more," and the reminder that our true treasure is found in the Kingdom of God.



In October, our themes were Pets, Fall/Leaves & Pumpkins, and Fire/Police and Safety. On Pet Day, the children brought a stuffed pet from home. We had an awesome group of 27 that served at FMSC and then stuck around to help with a number of service projects here at church. We put together over 300 boxes for OCC, signed cards for our shut-ins, prepped bags for Trunk or Treat, and put together 10 blankets for children.





In November, Youth Group will find us in the kitchen putting together all sorts of great meals. We also have our most popular nights of Hide and Seek and Bowling.

7th Grade Confirmation Lock-In is around the corner! Retreats and lockins are important times when youth and adults join together outside their elements, and there is so much growth that happens—it is awesome to see. This lock-in is always super special because it is run by college students from Concordia University Wisconsin.

"The Gathering Place Gives" Campaign is back. We are so thankful to everyone who gave to our campaign last year. This year we have a goal of \$45,000. These funds will help The Gathering Place and Memory Matters continue to give our families the much-needed respite at an affordable cost and will enrich the lives of our participants.

The Gathering Place is the only social model day program in Sheboygan County since 2008. We have served hundreds of individuals dealing with memory loss, and when you include the caregivers, it reaches thousands of people that have benefited from our programming. This campaign is to encourage you to donate a monetary gift towards one of our services here at The Gathering Place

such as: meals, art, entertainment, outings, and volunteer training. These are the services that are essential to the success of The Gathering Place and Memory Matters.

This year we are focusing on our "scholarship fund." Over the years, we have been blessed by many donors that have kept our scholarship funds up for individuals who are having a lot of financial burdens but can still really benefit from our programming. With the continued increase in health care costs, we have basically depleted this fund over all these years. This is an important piece to our abilities in helping more individuals dealing with memory concerns.

I have been asked in the past: how do we stay open and provide such exceptional care and charge such a minimal fee? First, it is because of our volunteers, but also a very big reason is because we have been blessed by so many that are willing to donate to our program. Whether it's through fundraisers, memorials, or donations, this is what enables us to keep our participants' fees low. An average cost of a day program across the U.S. charges a participant fee that is at least \$20.00 per day higher than what we

charge. And again, that is because of our successful fundraising. We are happy to be able to provide this needed program for individuals with memory loss in Sheboygan County. Help us continue our exceptional programming at an affordable cost.

ST. PAUL MEMORIAL GARDEN

The Columbarium and Memorial Garden is now complete! If you haven't visited it yet, please feel free to take a walk through. It is located on the northeast side of our property, near the shed/garage.

A columbarium is a storage facility comprised of niches, in which urns are placed. We currently have 3 columbarium units, which contain 64 individual niches each, for a total of 192 niches. Two urns can be placed in each niche. Currently, a niche costs \$2,200, which includes opening and closing costs.

Engraving is an additional cost. You can choose to have your door engraved at the time of purchase, or you can postpone that.
Engraving is \$675 for a 2-person niche and \$375 for a one-person niche. This price includes any preexisting death dates. There is an optional charge to prepay the engraving of the death date for \$300 per person. This can also be paid at the time of death at the price in place at that time.



All pricing is reviewed annually.

For an information packet and application, visit the Ministry House in the Gathering Area during the month of November. Otherwise, information packets are always available on the information wall in the Gathering Area and on our website. Please contact the Church Office with questions or to make an appointment for purchase.

OCTOBER COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

The Gathering Place Ministry Update: Leah Zehel reported that they are slowly building back up participants after several discharges. Currently working to balance volunteers with participants to ensure our programming remains high quality. We always need more volunteers, this would allow us to serve those on the waiting list. Leah did attend a recent health fair that did result in more volunteer interest. A volunteer training was held in September with a speaker from the ADRC, teaching about different types of memory loss, like Parkinsons and Frontal Temporal Dementia.

The Brat Fry in August was a big success, with our best financial outcome so far. November Giving preparation has begun with a goal of \$45,000, with a strong push for a scholarship fund.

Senior Pastor Update: Pr Kyle reported that 275 kids attended Trunk or Treat, with an estimate of 75% being non-members. It is a great outreach to the community.

The Pastors are reaching out to individuals 80 years and older that have had a deviation in attendance, some have now become shut ins. The Pastors are also reaching out to regular attenders that haven't attended since May.

The Chosen Bible Study has about 40-50 people attending weekly. AIM has 23 people attending and there is interest for January. The 11 am service is averaging 90 people. Staff are going over vision and values to ensure everyone has the same focus. The District Pastors Conference was last week.

In the last 28 days Youtube has had 4,374 views. We had 8 new subscribers for a total of 764.

Policy #68 – Membership for Children of Non-Members: Pr Kyle shared a new proposed policy, requiring a parent to be a member for children under the age of 18. Discussion was held. The Elder Team will discuss the proposed policy further.

LCMS Presidential Election: The Synodical Convention is in the summer of 2026, which will include a Presidential Election. The Congregation and the Senior Pastor each submit a ballot. The Congregation will cast a ballot for Pastor Richard Snow.

September Treasurer's Report: Giving continues to improve. In terms of the budget, we are short by about \$94,000 if we spend as planned, but this is improving each month. A follow up letter to the Congregation was discussed. Pr Kyle will include information in his December stewardship letter. This letter will also include other tax saving ways to donate.
