SOLA: STANDING FIRM ON GOD'S WORD

'But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from who you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.'

- 2 Timothy 3:14-15

Fall is in the air in Wisconsin! At the time of this writing, the leaves are just starting to change color and drift down from the trees. As we enter this season, the air feels a little crisper, football games fill the weekends, apple orchards and pumpkin patches are buzzing with activity, and everything suddenly seems to come in "pumpkin spice." Fall brings with it so many joys and traditions—and a vivid reminder that the seasons are always changing.

This fall at St. Paul we are beginning a new sermon series called "**Sola**," leading

us toward Reformation Sunday. Sola is a Latin word meaning "alone." During the Reformation, God used Martin Luther and other reformers to call His Church back to what really matters: standing firm on what God alone provides. Over the coming weeks, we'll focus on four key "solas" of the Reformation and why they still matter for us today:

Scripture Alone – God's Word isn't just filled with truth—it *is* truth. It is the standard that never changes, the story of salvation that

shapes our lives and draws us back to Jesus.

Faith Alone – Our salvation doesn't rest on our works or efforts but on trusting in Jesus and what He has done for us. Faith is God's gift that keeps pointing us back to Christ even when doubts, struggles, or temptations threaten to shake us.

Grace Alone – Like the father in the Parable of the Prodigal Son, God pours out His love freely. Grace welcomes us when we wander, forgives us when we repent, and humbles us when we become self-righteous. Grace is our only hope.

Christ Alone – In the end, it all centers on Jesus. He is the Lamb who was slain, the way to eternal life, and the reason we will one day stand with the saints in glory. Our hope is not in what we do but in who He is and what He has done.

These truths are not just for the history books. They are for you, your family, and your neighbors right now. They shape how we live, how we forgive, how we serve, and how we love. And they give us something solid to stand on in a world that keeps changing.

At St. Paul, our mission is "Connecting People to Christ." That's exactly what the "solas" do. Scripture points us to Christ. Faith clings to Christ. Grace flows from Christ. And salvation is found in Christ alone. This fall, let's walk together in these truths and invite others to do the same—because everyone needs the hope that only Jesus can give.

So as the leaves turn and the seasons shift, let us rejoice in this: our God does not change. His Word endures. His promises stand. And in Christ alone, by grace alone, through faith alone, revealed in Scripture alone, we are connected to Christ—today and forever!

Off to a Great Start!

We have had a great start to the new year at St. Paul Early Childhood Center. We have 14 children in 4K, 19 Preschoolers, and 22 children using the Child Care at some time each week. The children and teachers have gotten to know each other and are having lots of fun learning each day. The children are becoming familiar with the school routines and beginning to make new friends.

The 4K class has already taken a walk to the falls, played at River Park, and gone to Memorial Library. Miss Britt, the librarian, comes every month to the Early Childhood Center to read to the Preschool and Child Care classes. Mr. Walkenhorst visited the classrooms to introduce himself, play his guitar, and teach songs about fall. Pastor Adam tells the Bible story once a week in Child Care and once a month in Preschool and 4K. Everyone also attended their first Chapel day to meet Pastor Kyle and praise God in a church setting.



We continue to collect used ink cartridges, HP toner, and old cell phones. These can be placed in the Early Childhood bin in the church's collection center. We receive money for the ink and phones which help us purchase materials for the classrooms. We are also looking for Crystal Light containers and extra-large nuts and bolts.

Greetings from The Hispanic Outreach ministry! The Lord continues His work through the Hispanic Ministry in Sheboygan County. Thanks to God for His continue work in our midst!

Evangelizing at the Latin Barber Shop – Friday, September 19th

Last Friday, September 19th, I visited the Latin Barber Shop in Sheboygan. As part of my ministry, I like to visit places where Hispanics gather, to meet new people and seek opportunities to share the Gospel with them. I spent about three hours there and had the chance to talk with several individuals. I always wear my clerical collar so people can identify me as a church worker.

While I was there, one person pulled me aside to a corner because he needed someone to talk to. He began sharing the struggles he was facing. I gladly listened, offered him advice, and when he asked, I prayed for him. After the prayer, I gave him a hug, and he left. I could see how that man, who initially seemed tired and troubled, walked away filled with joy—blessed by God right there in that barbershop! I thank God for placing me in the right place to share His words of life and encouragement.

Later, I met a 20-year-old young woman. We spent quite some time talking about God. At one point, she asked if I was a Catholic priest. I told her I wasn't—that I'm a Lutheran pastor. She explained that she had been looking for a Catholic Church to visit but hadn't found one she liked yet. I told her, "God put you in my path today so you can find the right place. I want to introduce you to a church where the Gospel is preached exactly as it is, and the sacraments are administered according to the Lord's intention."

She responded, "What is it like? Tell me more. What is the Lutheran Church?" I explained what we believe, teach, and confess in the Lutheran Church. She said, "That sounds interesting."

I invited her to our Sunday service, and she replied, "I'll be there, God willing." And she came! Not only that—she brought her mother and younger sister too. After the Divine Service, I asked them, "How did you like it?" and all three said they really enjoyed the service and would come back. Praise God for bringing them to His house!

Later that day, I sent them a message thanking them for joining us. They replied, "We are really happy to have been in God's house today," and also asked, "Can you say a prayer tomorrow? It's our mother's birthday." I responded, "Yes, with great pleasure." Early the next morning, I prayed for her and sent her a written birthday prayer.

The work with this family will continue. I thank God for placing them in my path so that His Kingdom may continue to grow.

FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

2025 Feed My Starving Children MobilePack is Here!



After many months of planning and fundraising, the 12th Annual Feed My Starving Children MobilePack is here, happening October 9-11, 2025. Feed My Starving Children provides life-saving meals to people in more than 70 countries worldwide, truly turning Hunger into Hope.

This MobilePack at St. Paul is a testament to our mission as a church. As Friends of God through Jesus, empowered by the Spirit, we are connecting people to Christ by sharing His love in word and action everywhere. God confirms this mission in Proverbs 22:9: 'Blessed are those who are generous because they feed the poor.' God bless the food we pack and those who so desperately need it.

THANK YOU to all who have supported this life-changing mission—through monetary support, volunteerism, or prayer. We couldn't have done it without you.

PILLOWCASE DRESS MISSION PROJECT

Finally, after a hot summer, fall is here! Time to put away summer things and turn our attention to autumn activities. It could be time to bring out the sewing machine that was perhaps largely unused through the summer. Maybe get back to (or get started on) sewing a few pillowcase dresses. This mission project supplies the hundreds of dresses that our Mission Team will take with them to Guatemala in about 8-10 months, where they will be distributed to girls who desperately need sturdy clothing.

We also send a supply of shorts for boys – can't forget the boys! Sometimes, having decent clothes enables a child to attend school. If we accumulate more clothes than our mission team can transport, the extras are shipped to the Christian charity "Little Dresses for Africa," headquartered in Michigan.

If you have not yet tried sewing a pillowcase dress, it is really quite easy! A bin in the Giving Center contains a good supply of pillowcases. Take one or more home and give it a try. Instructions, hints, and a sample dress are in the bin, along with a smaller box containing other supplies (like bias tape). Completed dresses should be returned to the same bin.

We also need people to sew boys' shorts. They are even easier to sew than the dresses, if you can believe it! No fly or zipper – just an elastic waist. Instructions for the shorts are also in the bin. You can get two small pairs of shorts or one larger pair from one pillowcase.



Pillowcases are always needed – cotton or cotton-blend only, please. Especially needed are darker colors, which are more practical than white or lighter-colored pillowcases. Also needed are five suitcases for packing the clothes to be transported to Guatemala by our Mission Team. Ideally, the suitcases will have wheels and be large but not jumbo size. About 26-28 inches measured diagonally is ideal. These suitcases will not be returned. If you have questions or concerns, call the church office for information on how to contact Judy Konik.

SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Worship Ministry Update: Thomas Walkenhorst updated the Council on the status of various music ensembles some of which have added new members. A pianist is still being sought to occasionally accompany the choir. He shared some thoughts regarding possible future worship enhancements.

Senior Pastor Update: Pr. Kyle queried the council on a few questions: what brought you to St. Paul, why did you stay and what could be done better.

August Treasurer's Report: Average weekly giving for the first two months of the fiscal year is slightly higher than the average weekly giving for fiscal year 2025. However, if the current average weekly giving rate of \$24,663 does not increase we would fall about \$132,000 short of approved budgeted giving by fiscal year end.

SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Policy #67 - Memorial Garden Flag: "Half-staff" notifications are mandatory for various governmental facilities and optional for others. Without 24/7 staffing to properly comply with such notifications, the Memory Garden flag will remain at full staff at all times. The policy was approved and is available on our website.

Columbarium Loan: The Columbarium Committee recommended and Council approved:

- Paying back \$35 k of unused borrowed funds now. Any funds unused when final bills are paid should be repaid then.
- Paying back \$30 k of niche receipts to the Ministry Development loan.
- Having the current team (Pr. Kyle, Jo Miller, Bonnie Holzheimer, and Donna Felch) remain on the committee until at least June 30, 2026.

Elder Team Update: John Rische reported that the Elders recent meeting included hearing the Pastor's report and studying/discussing the 8th commandment in Luther's Small Catechism.
