### H — Heeding to Our Purity

- Holiness is being set apart (2 Peter 3:11).
- Godliness requires discipline (1 Timothy 4:7-8).
- Purity motivated by Christ's return (1 Corinthians 1:8; Colossians 3:4-5).

### E — Earnest About Our <u>Purpose</u>

- Believers are called to diligence (2 Peter 3:14).
- Pressing forward in the Christian life (Philippians 3:13-14).

### A - Attentive to His Promises

- Scoffers question Christ's return (2 Peter 3:3-4).
- God's timing differs from ours (2 Peter 3:8).
- Believers are to:
  - Wait for Christ (Philippians 3:20).
  - Watch for His coming (Titus 2:13).
  - Love His appearing (2 Timothy 4:8)

### V — Visionary Toward His <u>Plan</u>

• Warning against false teaching (2 Peter 3:16-17).

## N — Nourishing in Our <u>Progress</u>

• Spiritual growth is continual (2 Peter 3:18).
