5. Can you think of other biblical examples where God preserved a remnant?

6. What distinguishes the remnant from the rest of the people?
7. In today's world, what qualities or behaviors might mark someone as part of God's remnant?
8. How do faith and dependence on God make us stand out in a culture of self-reliance?

What Are They Called to Do? (Isaiah 10:24–27)

9. What instructions or encouragement does God give to the remnant in these verses?
10. What does it mean for us today to “not fear” when we're surrounded by opposition or pressure?
11. How can we, Northeast Presbyterian Church, actively live as God's remnant in our current context—church, community, or society?
