- 3. Intro
 - a. [1] New series → MULTIPLY go and make disciples...
 - i. **Image: seed producing a harvest of wheat**, each with the potential to create crops of new plants who do the same.
 - ii. New growth \rightarrow Ripple effect
 - b. So it is with the church. Designed by God Himself and intended to multiply
 - i. Revisit Great Commission
 - 1. Start with Verse attempt (have candy)
 - 2. [2] Read Mat 28:19-20 together
 - c. **Jesus didn't just want multiplication** of the Kingdom through **individual converts**, but also to baptize them → put them INTO THE CHURCH together in families.
 - i. Multiplication of disciples and local expressions of the church, local church communities/families HIS BODY
 - ii. With this series, we're going to build outward in. The call to plant churches is built upon the call for disciples to multiply disciples. Which is founded on the call for the spirit to be planted and grow in our hearts.

d. TODAY we're going to start on the outside → the call to MULTIPLY CHURCHES

4. Recognize the heat in the room:

- a. We're starting this series off with a little bit of elevated temperature around the call to multiply ... whether it be disciples or churches
- b. Sensed a little bit of heat discomfort
- c. Hopefully you can see that it's coming from God's Word and from Jesus himself
- d. And that it's just the right amount to help us move with him
 - i. Too much heat and ppl jump out! (TOO HOT!)
 - ii. Too little and we get comfortable, stuck, bored, and nothing happens
 - iii. But the goldilocks zone??? Oh yah
 - iv. That's my prayer that we'd be able to sit in the heat on this series
 - 1. In the warmth even if it's sometimes uncomfortable
 - 2. So that we can follow Jesus into what he's got next for us as a church and our community at large!
 - 3. Even if it's different from our experience or expectations
- e. Otherwise, at the end of the day, what are we doing? We're here to be CHRIST's body here in this world. Walking in the Good Works HE'S prepared in advance for us to walk in
 - i. Spreading the Good News and Growing his Kingdom
 - ii. Until the right time for him to return and take everything to the next level
- 5. Today: focus in on Acts 1:8
 - a. [3] But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.
 - b. **Principle:** Jesus wanted his disciples (and as we saw in Matthew 28 Great commission ALL believers) to fulfill the great commission starting where they were, moving out a little further, and then even further to the entire earth!
 - c. This is what happened
 - i. **1**st **Church planted right there in Jerusalem**. Then out a little to the region of all Judea, then out further to samaria (their regional enemies), and out to all the nations of the earth.
 - d. Church history: Gathered, scattered.
 - i. Persecution
 - e. Ripple effect outward
- 6. **The book of Acts is all about this** the ripple effect growth of the church as it spread throughout the known world.

- 7. We see in Acts 2 that on the first day of Pentecost 3,000 people came to faith, and they began to gather as the church (Acts 2:42-46) in Jerusalem.
- 8. By the time we get to Acts 13, we see the church has expanded to the city of Antioch
 - a. Modern day Turkey, just north of the Syrian border. The city is now known as Antakya
 - i. About 300 mi north of Jerusalem
 - ii. ~2-3wk journey on foot
 - b. They are sending Paul and Barnabas to the cities in the Mediterranean region for the purpose of evangelistic church planting.
 - i. In Acts 14:21-23, when Paul and Barnabas went into a particular city, they preached the gospel and people would respond. And a new church was born/planted there. Then they appointed pastors over the churches for the continued spiritual growth and edification of the people, and then they moved on.
 - c. And thus scores of new churches were planted throughout the known world.
- 9. **Early churches followed acts 1:8** and great commission model → call to multiply by making disciples who make disciples, churches that plant churches, rippling farther and farther out, witnessing to the Gospel throughout the world.
 - a. **WITNESS** → comes from the Greek word *martys*
 - i. Root word of MARTYR!
 - ii. Meaning not just someone who sees something but someone who **testifies of it** (like in a court), even at great personal cost.
- 10. Acts 1:8 is near and dear to our church's heart. It was the planting theme verse for our church back in 2014 when we first planted out of Westview Community Church.
 - a. Longing to see God's Spirit empower us as witnesses and move in and through us to plant a new beachhead of His Kingdom here in St. George and then continue to multiply and help plant churches throughout our broader area
 - i. Starting in Jerusalem: St George
 - ii. More broadly, Judea: MHK, Wamego
 - iii. Then a little further out → Samaria: Westmoreland, Riley, St Marys, JC
 - iv. And farther and farther into our whole state and nation, and across the whole world.
- 11. This is the call from Jesus from the beginning.
 - a. It's the foundational call we were planted from
 - b. The foundational vision we were planted WITH
 - c. And it continues to be the call of Jesus on our church heading into the future

12.[4] Why plant Churches?

- a. [5] Jesus commanded it
- b. [6] The early church practiced it very effectively
 - i. In only a few short decades, had planted churches across the known world!
 - ii. It's the story of the book of Acts, and the background/foundation for the rest of the NT
- c. [7] It's the most effective method of spreading the Gospel.
 - i. Better than advertising, social media
 - ii. Conferences, events
 - iii. Service projects
 - iv. Door to door evangelism
 - v. Even More effective than the ministry of existing churches
 - vi. "The single most effective evangelistic methodology under heaven is planting new churches" (Peter Wagner)
 - vii. Period.
 - viii. [8] CPs reach younger/next generation more effectively (Lifeway)
 - ix. [9] CPs primarily reach and draw in ppl who are not Christians or are disconnected from church, dechurched.
 - 1. 60-80% new CP members were not attending any worshipping body (stadia)
- d. [8] It's one of the most healthy things churches can do for themselves. It's best for existing churches!
 - 1. [11] CPCs grow faster themselves (lifeway)
 - 2. [12] Churches who plant other churches tend to have more stable income themselves.
 - 3. Even after they plant!
 - [13] CPCs baptize 3x more new believers than those churches who don't CP (stadia)
 - a. [14] New churches reach 10ppl for every 100 members
 - b. 3-15yr old churches 5 ppl for every 100 members
 - c. 15+ yo churches reach 3 ppl/100 members
 - 5. [15] CPCs are far more likely to engage in local and global missions and outreach efforts (lifeway)
- e. [16] We need more churches
 - i. Common misconception that we don't need more churches

- ii. It's actually not true! Not only are many existing churches largely ineffective in fulfilling the Great Commission, from a sheer numbers perspective, we still need MORE CHURCHES!
- iii. [17] As of a few years ago: the US alone needs to plant 3,000 new churches EACH YEAR just to keep up with population growth (stadia)
- iv. [18] What's more, 4,500 churches close each year.
 - 1. [19] Meaning we are LOSING churches 1,500/yr
 - 2. WE NEED MORE CHURCHES just to keep stable
- v. And we know that **people are open**, in many ways more than in a long time, to the Gospel and visiting churches.
 - 1. [20] 77% of ppl in the US believe in a higher power (stadia)
 - 2. [21] And 74% report wanting to grow spiritually
- vi. [22] Mat 9:37-28: THE HARVEST IS PLENTIFUL BUT THE WORKERS ARE FEW. Ask the Lord of the Harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.
- 13. Of course, we don't have to do it all alone by ourselves
 - a. The Lord commands his followers to pray for him to send out workers to plant and harvest. To plant new churches, reach the lost, and disciple them to do the same.
 - b. And as often happens, Jesus sends US!
 - c. What does Jesus do right after this? He sends his DISCIPLES OUT.
 - i. Not alone, but together. To do this work. Together.
- 14. We're a part of a network of churches in the Wesleyan Denomination that coordinate and work together in large part for this very purpose:
 - a. To plant churches according to the Acts 1:8 call and vision.

- 16. [24] John 12:24 -- ²⁴ Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds.
- 17. **Me: When I became a pastor,** one thing I honestly told myself and God I'd never do is plant a new church.
 - i. Too hard!, Uncomfortable, Uncertain.
 - ii. Not my personality.
 - iii. I'll work in existing churches. What I know.
 - iv. God will use me to care for the flock and send others to plant new churches.
 - v. It's dangerous to tell God what you will and won't do...
 - b. Then in 2018 I found myself planting a new church
 - i. Death to my plan for how I thought my Christian life would go
 - ii. How my experience of church would go.
 - iii. But God is all about raising the dead.
 - 1. And bringing about new life and Kingdom growth you'd never have expected.
 - 2. Not boring!
