Blessing of the Animals

Because of our great love for our pets, we are planning our first Blessing of the Animals service for Saturday, May 31. This will be held on the West Side lawn and parking lot. Beginning at 10 a.m., we anticipate the actual service lasting between 5 and 10 minutes. We will read scriptures on the importance of animals, sing a hymn or two about the majesty of God's creatures, and pray over all our pets. Each animal will receive a personal blessing, certificate, and gift. While is not required to pre-register your pet for this event, it is strongly suggested. There is a waiver that must be signed, and we will want you to have time read over that waiver. For example, dogs and cats must be on leashes and in owner's control at all times. All other pets must be in their cages, aquariums, terrariums, etc. at all times. No animal is to be allowed in the building (unless for service purposes). Waivers must be signed before a pet will be allowed on the property out of the car. Contact the office at any time to register your pet and receiver a waiver. We cannot wait to celebrate your love for your pets with you on May 31.

¹⁵ When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶ A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." ¹⁷ He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. ¹⁸ Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." ¹⁹ (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, "Follow me."
