## Deuteronomy 15:4-18

### Launch

This week we learned that God's purpose for us involves being generous. Moses addresses the Israelites telling them that there shall be no poor among them in the Land. That they are a people called to be generous to others because God has been generous to them. This week we learned that generosity is not only about money but about actions in our everyday lives. No matter our wealth or situation there's always an opportunity to be generous within our community.

### Explore

Read through Deuteronomy 15:4-18.

### Apply

*How do you handle generosity? Is it something that comes naturally, or something that you have to remember to do?*

We can be generous because God was generous with us first. *How have you seen God move through generosity in your life? Have you ever been called to a hard moment of generosity and seen God use it in a special way?*
