CHEARTPRINT: OUR CREATOR GOD IS AWESOME

The Heartprint is the main Bible concept or truth from each unit that we want to imprint upon your child's heart. Repeating this Heartprint often may seem redundant, but it will serve as a vital aid in teaching this truth to your preschooler.

PRACTICE (6)

Practice to improve your child's small and large motor skills. Small motor skills include activities that involve the movement of small muscles utilizing hand-eye coordination. This involves things such as threading beads on yarn, playing with Play-Doh, cutting with scissors, and coloring with crayons. Large motor skills are activities that involve the large muscles of the arms, legs, and torso. They include things like jumping, running, riding a bike, and throwing and catching balls. Use these different activities to remind your child God is the creator each person and Our Creator God Is Awesome!

TALK 600

Name the different parts of the human body that are visible to your child (eyes, nose, arms, feet, etc.). Then talk about the different parts of the human body that aren't visible (brain, heart, lungs, bones, etc.). Go to your local library and check out some age-appropriate books that talk about the different parts of our bodies and how they all work together to keep our bodies functioning. Remind your child God designed our bodies so that it all works together in a specific way. When one part doesn't work correctly, it affects all of the other parts.
