- 2. Compare James 5:1-6 to those previous mentions of wealthy people in the book of James, does his tone change in chapter five? In what way?
- 3. Lance talked about misplaced treasure, what is the danger of misplaced treasure according to James 5:1-3? Is it wrong to save, invest or plan for the future? Why? Why not?
- 4. Is this warning for all rich people, of all time, or just for the people in James' time or maybe just for certain rich people?
