- What is one thing you would do differently this week as a result of this message?

Core: Read 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

1. What are some key characteristics of a great coworker? Paul describes himself as working together with Jesus. Do you feel like you are a coworker with Jesus? Why? Why not?
2. What would it look like for someone to receive God's grace in vain? Give an example.
3. According to chapter six, when is an appropriate time to say yes to Jesus? What makes today a favorable day to accept God's grace?
4. Do you think we ever make it more difficult for people to begin a relationship or grow their relationship with Jesus than necessary? What are some of these obstacles that we put in the way?

5. What kinds of hardships did Paul endure for the sake of the gospel? Do we ever face any difficulties due to our choice to follow Jesus? What kind of struggles have you endured for Jesus?

6. How was Paul able to respond well to troubles of every kind? What is our tendency when we face troubles? What encouragement do you find in verses 6-10 to help us face these difficulties?

7. What do you think Paul means when he says his “heart is wide open?”

8. Compare Paul’s wide open heart to the restricted affections of the Corinthians. Have you ever felt restricted in your ability to love others? How can you live with a more wide open heart?

9. As Paul has this conversation about widening their hearts, why do you think he mentions speaking to the church as if they were children?

10. When you think of a person with a “wide open” heart, who comes to mind? What has that person taught you about widening your own heart?
